8:30 am	<p style="text-align: center;">Positive Behavior Management Strategies for Afterschool Programs – Dr. Jenell Holstead</p> <p>Dr. Jenell Holstead has a Ph.D. in School Psychology from Indiana University, an M.S. in Educational Psychology from Indiana University, and a B.A. in Psychology from The Pennsylvania State University. She teaches courses on research methodology at the University of Wisconsin, and her research interests focus on the effectiveness of afterschool programs. Dr. Holstead has worked in program evaluation for the past 12 years, with expertise in educational research. She has evaluated youth development programs and initiatives, afterschool programs, early childhood and school-age environments, and educational initiatives.</p> <p>Dr. Holstead regularly provides professional development trainings and workshops on point-of-service practices to youth development organizations on topics such as behavior management strategies, working with special education students, and improving academic and social-emotional outcomes of youth. In addition, she also gives technical assistance workshops to organizations on evaluation, making informed data-based decisions, advocating for programming and sustainability issues, and leveraging community resources.</p> <p>*This workshop on Behavior Management Strategies for Afterschool Programs is an excellent opportunity to invite your center coordinators and other front line OST staff members to participate.</p>
