



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

"There is created the accountability, accreditation, student performance, and resource inequity task force to study academic opportunities, inequities, promising practices in schools, and improvements to the accountability and accreditation system [...] The task force will "study the statewide K-12 education accountability system in order to address resource inequities contributing to student performance, and, in connection therewith, make an appropriation."

### At minimum consider:

(1) ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITIES OR INEQUITIES THAT MAY IMPACT ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT GAPS;

(2)IMPROVEMENTS TO THE ACCOUNTABILITY AND ACCREDITATION SYSTEM TO EXPAND AND INCENTIVIZE ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITIES AND ADDRESS INEQUITIES;

- (3) PROMISING PRACTICES IN SCHOOLS AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS; AND
- (4) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR LEGISLATION OR RULES, AS NECESSARY.

### Consult:

"PARENT ORGANIZATIONS, STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS, AND ADDITIONAL STAKEHOLDERS AS NEEDED TO ADDRESS QUESTIONS NECESSARY TO FINALIZE ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS"
