

# Industry-Recognized Credentials: Data Submission Guidelines

# Background

The calculation of matriculation rates for state accountability determinations relies on data provided by the Department of Higher Education and includes community college enrollment, four year higher education institution enrollment, CTE enrollment and/or certificates or degrees earned prior to graduation. To present, industry-recognized credentials have been unavailable for inclusion within the matriculation rate calculations (i.e. except for those certificates awarded by the three Colorado area technical colleges).

In order to address this credential gap and to allow districts to better demonstrate the range of their success; we are making available an optional data submission to allow districts to provide data related to other industry-related credentials that were earned while students were still

enrolled in high school. This submission will include data from 2016-2017 high school graduates. The submitted data that is approved will be incorporated into CTE and overall matriculation rates at both the school and district levels. This submission is optional as some districts may not record and/or have students that have been awarded industry credentials.

# Process

#### Submission Timeline

On an annual basis, during the month of April, industry credential data may be submitted by Accountability contacts to CDE (via Syncplicity) using the provided data template.

Prior to submission, a district designated accountability contact should notify CDE by e-mail of their intent to submit the file. The e-mail should include their district number along with contact information. Failure to provide this message of intent and/or the posting of the flat file prior to 5 p.m. on April 30<sup>th</sup> will exclude the data from consideration.

Key Dates & Actions are as follows:

- Submission Opens, April 2<sup>nd</sup> (Monday), no earlier than 8 a.m. the submission templates will be made available in Syncplicity to Accountability contacts. At this time, letters of intent and data file submissions will be accepted.
- From April 1st to April 30th, notifications of intent to submit must be sent to Dan Jorgensen prior to data file submission via e-mail at: <u>Jorgensen\_d@cde.state.co.us</u>.
- Submission Closes, April 30<sup>th</sup> (Monday) by 5 p.m., all letters of intent and data files must be submitted for consideration.

### Intent to Submit Message

The intent to submit message is required to ensure all submitted data files have successfully transferred, adequate staffing exists for file preparation and to ensure CDE has appropriate district level contacts identified should questions arise. So, the earlier the message is submitted the better. Once the message is sent, the district may submit their data file via Syncplicity.

The message should be e-mailed to Dan Jorgensen at: <u>Jorgensen\_d@cde.state.co.us</u>. It should contain the following information with updated district and contact information.

**Message:** 'An Industry-related credentials submission will be made on behalf of [district number/district name here]. # Template & File Transfer

The data template for submission will be made available at 8 a.m. on April 1<sup>st</sup> to District Accountability Contacts. The template will be made available via Syncplicity, CDEs secured file transfer system. It will be posted within the Accountability\_Contact sub-folder called, Industry Credentials Submission. The name of the template is '2018 Credential Submission Template'. The template should be downloaded from this folder, populated, and then returned to the same location with the four number district code included as part of its name. For example, '0180\_2018 Credential Submission'.
