

2015 Reading Grade 4: Average Scale Score (Figure 1)

Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2015, the average score in Colorado (224) was

- lower than those in 7 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 16 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 28 states/jurisdictions

DoDEA = Department of Defense Education Activity (overseas and domestic schools)

Figure 1 shows how Colorado 4th graders performed in the 2015 NAEP *Reading* assessment in comparison to the other 49 states, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense schools. This is a comparison using the average scale score for each state. Colorado which is shaded orange is the focal state. States shaded light blue scored higher than Colorado. Dark-blue shaded states scored lower than Colorado and grey-shaded states scored the same as Colorado. Because NAEP results are based on samples, there is a margin of error associated with each score or percentage. Therefore, only those differences in scores or percentages that meet NAEP's standards for statistical significance are reported as higher or lower.

2015 Reading Grade 4: Comparison to other states (Table 1)

Table 1 shows how Colorado 4th graders performed in comparison to other states in average scale score. CO, the focal state, is shaded blue. States shaded green performed higher than CO. Massachusetts, Department of Defense, New Hampshire, Vermont, New Jersey, Connecticut and Wyoming scored higher. States/jurisdictions that are shaded yellow performed about the same as CO. The 28 states that scored the same as CO are shaded yellow and listed below in rank order with their respective scores. The 16 states that are shaded rose scored lower than Colorado. All states are show with their respective scores.

Figure 2 shows how Colorado performed in comparison to other states/jurisdictions in the grade 4 2015 NAEP *Reading* assessment in average scale score. Seven states/jurisdictions performed higher than CO. Twenty-eight states/jurisdictions scored the same as CO. Last, sixteen states scored lower than CO.

Average Scale Score: CO v. the National Public (Figure 3)



Figure 3 shows how CO compares to the National Public in the 2015 grade 4 NAEP *Reading* assessment in average scale score. CO had an average scale score of 224 and the National Public sample had a score of 221. Colorado performed the same as the National Public in the reading assessment. Both Colorado and the National Public scored the same as they did in the 2013 test.

2015 Reading Grade 4: Average Level Percentages and Average Score Results: (Figure 4)

Figure 4 shows a comparison of the grade 4 trend results comparing 1998, 2013 and 2015 for CO using average scale score and achievement-level percentages. The 2015 National (public) scale score and achievement-level percentages are also compared. A score with an asterisk means that it is significantly different than the 2015 score.

Figure 5 shows the percent of students for CO and the National Public scoring at the *Proficient or Above* achievement levels (*Proficient and Advanced*) on the 2015 grade four reading test. CO had 39 percent of its students that scored at the *Proficient or Above* achievement levels. The National Public had 36 percent of the students that scored at the same levels. There was no difference between Colorado and the National Public in the percent of students scoring at *Proficient or Above*. Neither

Colorado nor the National Public had any significant difference in students scoring at *Proficient or Above* in 2015 compared to 2013.


Figure 6 shows how Colorado performed in comparison to other states/jurisdictions in the grade 4 2015 NAEP *Reading* assessment in scoring at the *Proficient or Above* achievement levels in 2015. Four states performed higher than CO. Thirty-two states scored the same as CO. Last, fifteen states scored lower than CO.

2015 Reading Grade 8: Average Scale Score (Figure 1)

Compare the Average Score in 2015 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2015, the average score in Colorado (268) was

- lower than those in 5 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 20 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 26 states/jurisdictions

Figure 1 shows how Colorado 8th graders performed in the 2015 NAEP *Reading* assessment in comparison to the other 49 states, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense schools. This is a comparison using the average scale score for each state. Colorado which is shaded orange is the focal state. States shaded light blue scored higher than Colorado. Dark-blue shaded states scored lower than Colorado and grey-shaded states scored the same as Colorado. Because NAEP results are based on samples, there is a margin of error associated with each score or percentage. Therefore, only those differences in scores or percentages that meet NAEP's standards for statistical significance are reported as higher or lower.

2015 Reading Grade 8: Comparison to other states (Table 1)

Table 1 shows how Colorado performed in comparison to other states in average scale score. CO, the focal state, is shaded blue. States shaded green performed higher than CO. The Department of Defense schools, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Vermont and Connecticut scored higher than CO. The twenty-six states that are shaded yellow performed about the same as CO and are listed below in rank order with their respective scores. Twenty states scored lower than Colorado. These 20 states are shaded rose and are listed below in rank order with respective scores.

Figure 2 shows how Colorado performed in comparison to other states/jurisdictions in the grade 8 2015 NAEP *Reading* assessment in average scale score. Five states performed higher than CO. Twenty-six states scored the same as CO. Last, twenty states scored lower than CO.



Figure 3 shows how CO compares to the National Public in the 2015 grade 8 NAEP *Reading* assessment in average scale score. CO had an average scale score of 268 and the National Public sample had a score of 264. CO performed significantly higher than the National Public in the reading assessment. CO did not score differently than in the 2013 test. The National Public scored significantly lower than in the 2013 test.

Figure 4 shows a comparison of the grade 8 *reading* trend results for 1998, 2013 and 2015 for CO using average scale score and achievement-level percentages. The 2015 National (public) scale score and achievement-level percentages are also compared. A score with an asterisk means that it is significantly different than the 2015 score.

Figure 5 shows the percent of students for CO and the National Public scoring at the *Proficient or Above* achievement levels (*Proficient and Advanced*) on the 2015 8th grade test. CO had 38 percent of its students that scored at the *Proficient or Above* achievement levels. The National Public had 33 percent of the students that scored at the *Proficient or Above* achievement

levels. On the 2015 test there was no difference between Colorado and the National Public's percentage of students scoring at these levels. Colorado did not have any significant difference in students scoring at *Proficient or Above* in 2015 compared to 2013. The National Public had a lower percentage of students scoring at *Proficient or Above* in 2015 than in 2013.

Figure 6 shows how Colorado performed in comparison to other states/jurisdictions in the grade 8 2015 NAEP *Reading* assessment in scoring at the *Proficient or Above* achievement levels in 2015. Four states performed higher than CO. Twenty-seven states scored the same as CO. Last, twenty states scored lower than CO.
