<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CDE will upload October Count data from Data Pipeline for initial registrations in PearsonAccess^{next} <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Test format will be set to “online” for all students unless notification is sent to CDE by December 15, 2017 From January 8-26, 2018, districts can make changes to student registration data in PearsonAccess^{next} through the user interface (UI) or SR/PNP files (transfer requests can also be sent/reviewed through UI or import/export) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Change test format to “paper” for students who need a paper-based version of the assessment Paper-based orders are derived from student registration data in PearsonAccess^{next} as of January 26, 2018

Test Structure and Administration		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each unit is a block of testing time for students • Math tests with units consisting of calculator and non-calculator sections (both completed during unit testing time): Grades 6-8 Math, Algebra I, Geometry, Integrated Math I & II • Units cannot be tested out of order, including for make-up testing (all content areas) 		
Computer-Based Testing (CBT)		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • May have different test forms and accessibility forms within a test session (if same directions and testing times) • Students requiring Auditory Presentation: Oral Script (for translation into language other than English or Spanish, including signed presentation) must be in a separate location and test session <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Students requiring Auditory Presentation: Text-to-Speech must have headphones to be in the same session; separate location is required if headphones cannot be used • Test Administrators can use “Combined View” to view multiple test sessions simultaneously in PearsonAccess^{next} 		
Paper-Based Testing (PBT)		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • May have different test forms within a test session (if same directions and testing times) • Students requiring Auditory Presentation: Oral Script must be in a separate location

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CMAS and CoAlt Procedures Manual: Section 6.0 (PARCC AF&A Manual must not be used) • CDE-created Accommodations Crosswalk • Unique Accommodation Request (UAR) Guidance Documents (UARs due to CDE by December 15, 2017) 		
Scratch Paper		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Scratch paper provided locally • Must be blank, but may have lines or be graph paper • Must be provided for PBT (all content areas) • CBT math – must be provided to students • CBT science, social studies, ELA – district decides if provided • All <u>used</u> scratch paper must be placed in the secure return envelope and returned to Pearson 		
Opening Test Packaging (plastic wrap)		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sealed packages may be opened no more than 4 days prior to testing 		
Official State Administration Window: April 9 – April 27, 2018		
<p>District and school-determined testing windows may be shorter than the allowable three week state administration window; however, all CMAS assessments must be completed by April 27, 2018. 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Secure Return Envelopes (for return of secure materials)		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Used</u> scratch paper (all content areas) • Student Testing Tickets and printed rosters may be securely destroyed or returned in secure return envelopes 		
Materials Return		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Science, social studies, math, and ELA materials can be returned together <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Scorable (i.e., paper-based tests that are to be scored) and nonscorable materials (i.e., secure material that will not be scored) returned in separate boxes ○ Labels: scorable = orange; nonscorable = blue • CSLA materials must be returned separately <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Label: scorable and nonscorable = yellow
