Tost format will be set to "enline" for all students unless notification is sent to CDE by December 15, 2017				

- o Test format will be set to "online" for all students unless notification is sent to CDE by December 15, 2017
- From January 8-26, 2018, districts can make changes to student registration data in PearsonAccess^{next} through the user interface (UI) or SR/PNP files (transfer requests can also be sent/reviewed through UI or import/export)
 - o Change test format to "paper" for students who need a paper-based version of the assessment
 - o Paper-based orders are derived from student registration data in PearsonAccess^{next} as of January 26, 2018

Test Administrators

- Test Administrators must be district employees
- Student teachers may not be Test Administrators, but may serve as proctors in the testing environment
- CoAlt Test Examiners must be certified teachers or licensed professionals

Initial Materials Shipment

- Wave 1
 - Test Coordinator Kits, including return shipping materials for all content areas (e.g., labels, header sheets)
 - o CMAS TAMs (CBT and/or PBT, contain information and administration "SAY" directions for all content areas)
- Student test materials: Wave 1 (extended math/ELA and early HS window) and/or Wave 2 (regular window)
 - o Math and ELA materials, including student ID labels
 - Science and social studies materials, including student ID labels

Test Structure and Administration

- Each unit is a block of testing time for students
- Math tests with units consisting of calculator and non-calculator sections (both completed during unit testing time): Grades 6-8 Math, Algebra I, Geometry, Integrated Math I & II
- Units cannot be tested out of order, including for make-up testing (all content areas)

Computer-Based Testing (CBT)

- May have different test forms and accessibility forms within a test session (if same directions and testing times)
- Students requiring Auditory Presentation: Oral Script (for translation into language other than English or Spanish, including signed presentation) must be in a separate location and test session
 - Students requiring Auditory Presentation: Text-to-Speech must have headphones to be in the same session;
 separate location is required if headphones cannot be used
- Test Administrators can use "Combined View" to view multiple test sessions simultaneously in PearsonAccess^{next}

Paper-Based Testing (PBT)

- May have different test forms within a test session (if same directions and testing times)
- Students requiring Auditory Presentation: Oral Script must be in a separate location

Accommodations Resources

Scratch Paper

- Scratch paper provided locally
- Must be blank, but may have lines or be graph paper
- Must be provided for PBT (all content areas)
- CBT math must be provided to students
- CBT science, social studies, ELA district decides if provided
- All <u>used</u> scratch paper must be placed in the secure return envelope and returned to Pearson

Opening Test Packaging (plastic wrap)

• Sealed packages may be opened no more than 4 days prior to testing

Official State Administration Window: April 9 - April 27, 2018

District and school-determined testing windows may be shorter than the allowable three week state administration window; however, all CMAS assessments must be completed by April 27, 2018. During official state window:

- Paper-based used as main testing format for math and ELA*
- All elementary and middle school science and social studies assessments (computer-based and paper-based)

Extended window for CBT math and ELA options*

- 4 total weeks (one additional week)
 - o April 2 April 27, 2018
- 5 total weeks (two additional weeks)
 - o March 26 April 27, 2018
 - March 19 April 27, 2018 (1 week spring break)

Early high school science options

- 3 total testing weeks (no additional weeks)
 - o March 26 April 13, 2018
 - o April 2 April 20, 2018
 - o April 9 April 27, 2018 (official state window)

*Students using accommodated PBT or CBT forms should test at the same time as their peers

Secure Return Envelopes (for return of secure materials)

- <u>Used</u> scratch paper (all content areas)
- Student Testing Tickets and printed rosters may be securely destroyed or returned in secure return envelopes

Materials Return

- Science, social studies, math, and ELA materials can be returned together
 - Scorable (i.e., paper-based tests that are to be scored) and nonscorable materials (i.e., secure material that will not be scored) returned in separate boxes
 - Labels: scorable = orange; nonscorable = blue
- CSLA materials must be returned separately
 - Label: scorable and nonscorable = yellow
