Title I – Part C Education of Migratory Children (Migrant Education Program)



PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL

(PAC)

Goals:

- *Ensure that migratory children who move among the States are not penalized in any manner by disparities among the States in curriculum, graduation requirements, and State academic content and student academic achievement standards.*
- *Ensure that migratory children receive full and appropriate opportunities to meet the same challenging State academic content and student academic achievement standards that all children are expected to meet.*

NCLB, Title 1-C

The Colorado Department of Education’s, Language, Culture & Equity Office is responsible for overseeing both the programmatic and fiscal portions of the eight regional programs including local schools districts.

Identification & Recruitment - The state MEP identifies and enrolls eligible students whose migratory lifestyle adversely impacts their academic success by assisting them to achieve educational goals. Eight regional education agencies throughout Colorado serve as liaisons coordinating program benefits and community resources among migrant families.

Data Collection – The state is required to compile information regarding services provided, the number of students by grade level, and academic information on eligible migrant students. The state is also required to submit the total number of migrant children eligible for funding to the *U.S. Department of Education, Office of Migrant Education.

Binational Program – The Binational Program was developed to provide migrant students from Mexico access to the same free, appropriate public school education that is provided to other children.

Some additional services are:

- Transfer Documents (records transcripts)
- Educational Materials & Information
- Professional Training
- Portable Assisted Study Sequence (PASS)

Migrant Youth Leadership Institute

The State MEP Program annually hosts MYC Leadership Institute the summer, which provide information to youth about leadership skills, scholarship opportunities, health awareness and exposure to the college environment. The Council consists of a regional director, state MEP staff, regional MEP staff and eligible secondary migrant students.

National Migrant Education Hotline

The Hotline uses a toll free (1-800) Hotline number to serve migrant families nationally. The Hotline goal is to provide assistance with education, medical services, food, shelter, clothing and emergencies calls to the Hotline for Colorado are received at the CDE/MEP office. By receiving calls directly at our office, services are provided to migrant families in a more effective and efficient manner.

Health Services

Health services address significant need of the migrant student. Services are provided at the state, regional and local levels.

The law requires the MEP to utilize PACs at the state and regional levels. The regional PAC is critical in providing feedback to the local Director of how to better improve the quality of education for migrant students. Regional
