Purpose and Value of State Assessments

- Information for parents and communities
 - Did my child meet the state standards on CMAS?
 - How is my child doing compared to other students in his or her grade?
 - How are schools and districts doing in preparing students for academic success?
- Information educators need to help improve instruction.
- Information for charter authorizers to evaluate program.
- Identification of districts and schools in need of support.
- Recognition of high performing systems so others may learn from them.



How State Assessments Advance the Charter Schools Act

- Legislative declaration § 22-30.5-102, C.R.S.
 - To improve student learning by creating schools with rigorous performance standards.
 - To promote data analysis and participation in state assessments.
 - To encourage the formation of research-based charter schools that use programs proven to be effective.
 - To hold charter schools accountable for performance through the "Education Accountability Act of 2009."
- Charter application requirements § 22-30.5-106, C.R.S.
- Charter authorizer oversight § 22-30.5-110, C.R.S.

CMAS ELA and Math: Updates

What's Different?

- No CMAS testing in grade 9 (now PSAT).
- Consistent unit timing within grade and content area.
- No standalone ELA field test units (now wrapped into the testing window).
- Grades 3-5 math testing times reduced from four to three 60 minute units.
- Grades 6-8 math unit 1 structure now the same.



CMAS Science and Social Studies: Updates

What's Different?

- Consistent unit timing within grade and content area.
- High school science unit testing times reduced from 60 to 50 minutes.
- Sample items removed from unit 1 for all science and social studies tests (consistent with ELA and math).

Considerations for 2019

- The 3-year social studies sampling plan cycle will restart next year.
- Decisions regarding Grade 11 Social Studies for 2019 are expected to be determined prior to the start of the 2018-2019 school year.

Colorado's State Accountability System

Education Accountability Act of 2009

- Authorizes CDE to conduct an annual review of public school and district performance.
- Authorizes CDE to make recommendations to the State Board of Education concerning school improvement plans and accreditation categories.
- Based on the notion that every student should have an opportunity to receive an excellent education and graduate ready to succeed.
 - Successful schools recognized, struggling schools identified for support.



Ratings are Based on Three Categories of Performance

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

Average scores on state assessments in each grade.

The average is sometimes called the "mean scale score."

Using the average score ensures that the achievement of all students and disaggregate groups is incorporated into this component of school ratings. (English language arts, math and science)

ACADEMIC GROWTH

Progress students make in their achievement on assessments from one year to the next. Growth is calculated on the following assessments:

- · CMAS assessments in English language arts and math
- PSAT and SAT assessments given to high school students
- ACCESS assessment for all students and disaggregate groups who are still learning the English language

POSTSECONDARY READINESS

High school and district ratings depend on the following factors, which indicate how well schools are preparing students for college and the workforce.

- Graduation rates
- Dropout rates
- · Matriculation into a college or career certificate program
- · Average scores on the SAT college entrance exam

How Scores are Weighted for Elementary and Middle Schools

40% Academic Achievement

> 60% Academic Growth

How Scores are Weighted for High School and Districts

30% Academic Achievement

> 40% Academic Growth

30% Postsecondary Readiness



below 95% participation, once parent excuses are removed, in 2 or more content areas





What is Unified Improvement Planning?

Alignment	A system to align improvement planning requirements for state and federal accountability into a "single" plan.
Documentation	A common format for schools and districts to document improvement planning efforts. Schools/districts on accountability clock must demonstrate a coherent plan for dramatic change and adjustments over time. Reviews conducted by CDE and the State Review Panel.
Transparency	A process for including multiple voices, including staff, families and community representatives. Plans are also posted publicly.
Best Practice	A statewide strategy to promote improvement planning based on best- practice, including use of state, local data, and engagement in a continuous improvement cycle.
Support	A mechanism for triggering additional supports through CDE (especially for schools/districts on accountability clock).


Unified Improvement Plans

Timeline Considerations


- Requires all schools and districts to draft a plan annually.
- Biennial flexibility for Performance schools.
- Schools with Turnaround or Priority Improvement ratings submit UIPs to CDE for review annually (January).
- All schools (regardless of rating) submit UIPs to CDE for public posting (annually in April, except if eligible for biennial flex).
