Materials for required prevention of harassment, discrimination, and bullying training

State law requires public schools to provide training to all employees about discrimination and harassment as defined in [C.R.S. 22-1-143](#) starting in the 2025-26 school year. The deadline for employees to complete training is December 31, 2025. State Board of Education launches remote public comment

To make the public comment process more accessible to all Coloradans, the State Board of Education is launching remote (virtual) public comment! This new option will be available starting at the board's August meeting on August 20 and speakers can sign up online starting at 12pm on August 13. From CCSSO: Fiscal Year 2026 Appropriations Advances in Senate

Last week, the Senate Committee on Appropriations advanced the FY 2026 Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education Appropriations Act (LHHS) by a bipartisan vote of 26-3. The Senate legislation includes a \$50 million increase for education for the disadvantaged and a \$50 million increase for IDEA over current funding levels. The bipartisan Senate bill does not propose consolidating or eliminating certain K-12 or IDEA programs, which had been proposed in the President's FY 2026 budget proposal. Importantly, this legislation also includes new language requiring ED to provide funds to states on the date they become available for obligation, meaning July 1 or October 1. The House Appropriations Committee is planning to markup their version of the FY 2026 LHHS bill after the August recess.

Title I-C Funding and Services for Students

As we shared in the Aug. 4 update, we have received the Title I-C Migrant Education Program federal funding for the 2025–2026 fiscal year. We plan to continue working with the existing regional partners so they can continue providing seamless supports. As you begin the school year, **please be sure to include the Occupational Survey in your registration packets** ([English](#); [Spanish](#)). This important tool helps us identify eligible students for Title I-C and ensure they receive the services
