

NCLB FY 06-07 ALLOCATIONS

Revised Final FY 2006-07 allocations for Title IIA, Teacher Quality, Title IID, Technology and Title V, Innovative programs have been posted to CDE's website. The revised FY 2006-07 allocations for Title I, Part A, Title I, Neglected and Title I Delinquent Institutions Grants were previously posted to CDE's website. All other allocations are final and remain the same as the previous posting.

These revisions are necessary because of an error the Census Bureau made in processing the data used in its model to generate its 2003 poverty estimates, which are part of the statutory data the U.S. Department of Education must use to calculate fiscal year FY 2006-07 (school year 2006-07) allocations. This error, which was very recently reported to the U.S.D.E and to CDE, changed the number of children from low-income families counted in the Part A formula used to calculate FY 2006-07 State and LEA allocations. Government Accountability Office (GAO) principles and several opinions issued by the Comptroller General require the U.S.D.E. to recalculate its FY 2006-07 State and LEA Title I, Part A allocations to reflect these corrections in the Census poverty estimates.

We realize that you may have already submitted budgets based on final allocations, and apologize for the work these revisions will cause.

You may submit your budget revisions using the corrected allocations and ***actual*** carryover amounts at the same time as you submit the annual financial report. Revisions received by November 30, 2006 will be reviewed as soon as they are received.

Districts and BOCES are required to submit a revised NCLB consolidated electronic budget reflecting these changes. You have up until March 1, 2007 to revise your budget

The U.S.D.E base these allocations on income year 2003 census estimates of the number of related children ages 5-17 in families in poverty, the total school-age population, and the total resident population for each LEA. In addition to the 2003 census data, these allocations factor in final State per-pupil expenditure data from SY 2003-04 and data on the number of children in locally operated neglected or delinquent institutions, foster homes, and families above poverty receiving assistance under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program.

Column 1: Title I, Part A - Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged

Program focuses on services that improve the teaching and learning of children at risk of not meeting challenging academic standards, especially those children who reside in areas with high concentrations of children from low-income families.

This amount is the total of Basic, Concentration, Targeted, and EFIG allocations. This allocation also includes the neglected facility allocation for your district, but does not include the delinquent facility allocation (Title I-D). A separate application and budget is needed for the delinquent funding.

Column 2: Title II, Part A – Improving Teacher Quality Grants

Program focuses on preparing, training and recruiting high quality teachers.

Funds are allocated to LEAs by formula. LEAs first receive the amount allocated in FY 2001-2002 for the Eisenhower Professional Development State Grants and Class-Size Reduction programs. 20% of the remaining funds are allocated to LEA's based on population (ages 5-17 as determined by the U.S. Department of Education) and 80% of the remaining funds are allocated to LEA's based on children ages 5-17 from families with incomes below the poverty line (as determined by the U.S. Department of Education).

Column 3: Title II, Part D – Enhancing Education Through Technology

Provides funds for innovative initiatives using technology, increasing access to technology, and professional development.

The state allocates 50% of funds to LEAs based on prior year Title I shares. The other 50% is used for competitive awards to high-need LEA's or partnerships that include high-need LEA's.

Column 4: Title III – English Language Acquisition, Language Enhancement and Academic Achievement of English Language Learners (ELL)

Provides funds to assist limited English proficient (LEP) children attain English proficiency and meet State academic standards.

Funds are allocated to LEAs based on the LEAs share of the LEP student population.

If signing over the allocation to a BOCES, and the BOCES total is now over \$10,000 a separate consortium budget is NOT required. The BOCES will include budget information in its NCLB Consolidated application budget file. Districts who do not sign over funds to a BOCES and whose allocation is less than \$10,000 must apply for funding through a consortiums of districts with the lead agency for the consortium providing the budget information in it's NCLB Consolidated application budget file.

Column 5: Title III – English Language Acquisition, Language Enhancement and Academic Achievement for English Language Learners (ELL) Immigrant Set-Aside

Funds are awarded to school districts that have experienced a significant increase, as compared to the average of the 2 preceding fiscal years, in the number of immigrant children and youth, who have enrolled during the fiscal year preceding the fiscal year for which the subgrant is made. Funds are allocated per pupil times the increase in immigrant children.

A separate Title III, Immigrant Set-Aside Budget is not required, provide the budget information within the districts or BOCES NCLB Consolidated application budget file.

Column 6: Title IV, Part A – Safe and Drug Free Schools

Provides funds for drug and violence prevention, character education, community service projects, conflict resolution and peer mediation programs, and other activities.

Allocations to LEA's are based on 60% on the LEA's relative share of previous year's Title I, Part A allocation and 40% is based on the October 2005 membership count reported to CDE.

Column 7: Title V, Part A – Innovative Programs

Provides funds for education improvement programs, instructional and media materials, professional development, and other activities.

Allocations are based on school age population. 83% of funds are allocated to LEA's based on children living in areas with concentrations of economically disadvantaged families; 16% of funds are allocated to LEA's with a percentage of economically disadvantaged children higher than 15%, based on the Title I Poverty count received from the US Department of Education. The remaining 1% is allocated to LEA's with less than one school age child per geographic square mile of the district.

Column 8: Title VI, Part B – Rural, Low Income

Funds may be used for (1) teacher recruitment and retention; (2) professional development; (3) educational technology; (4) parental involvement activities; (5) activities authorized under Safe and Drug-Free Schools; (6) activities authorized under Part A of Title I; and (7) activities authorized under Title III.

Allocations are based on the LEA's share of students in average daily attendance in eligible districts.
