

IDEA, Part B Allocations, ARRA

- Column 1 -- Eighty-five percent of the dollars are allocated according to the numbers of elementary and secondary students within the boundaries of each administrative unit. This includes students receiving educational services from the administrative unit or State operated program, as well as students in private and parochial schools, and in eligible facilities that are located within the boundaries of the administrative unit.
- Column 2 -- Fifteen percent of the dollars are allocated according to the numbers of children living in poverty within each administrative unit. The poverty numbers in the School Finance funding formula are used for this purpose.
- Column 3 --- This is the total allocation for each administrative unit and State operated program for IDEA, Part B, ARRA funds.
- Column 4 – Fifty percent of the total allocation for each administrative unit and State operated program is available from February 17, 2009 through September 30, 2011, while the remaining fifty percent will become available at a later date and be available from July 1, 2009 through September 30, 2011.
