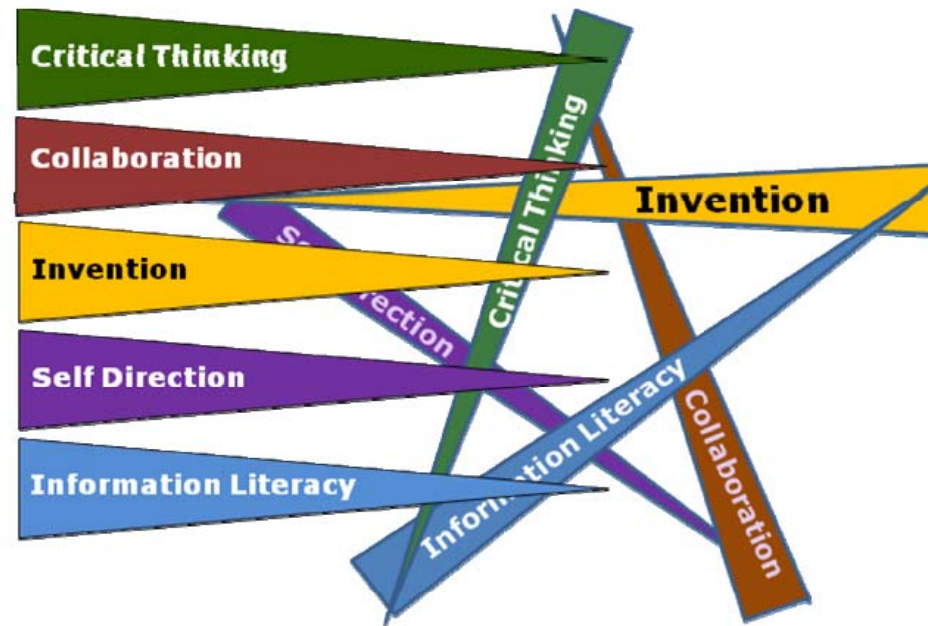

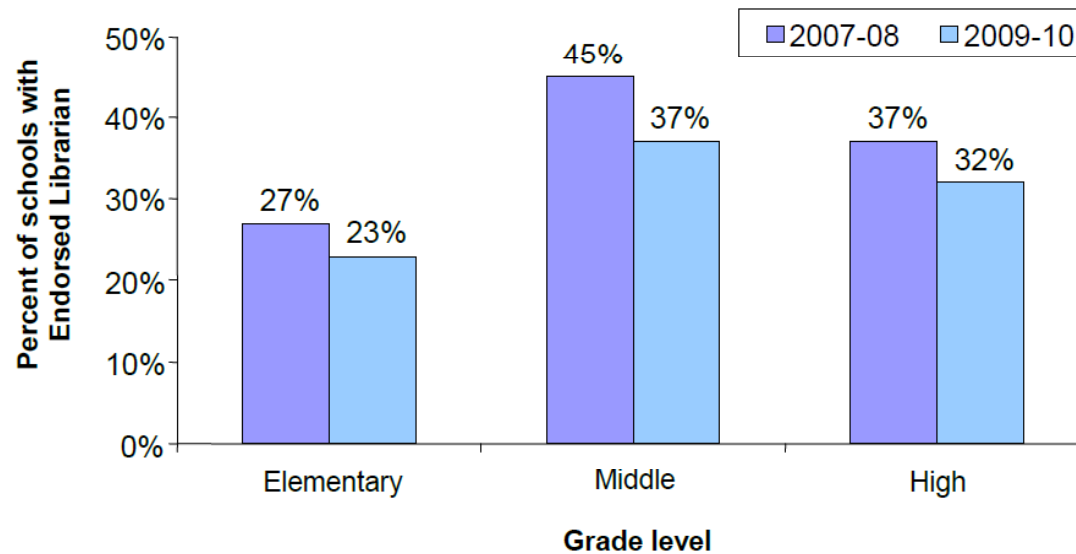

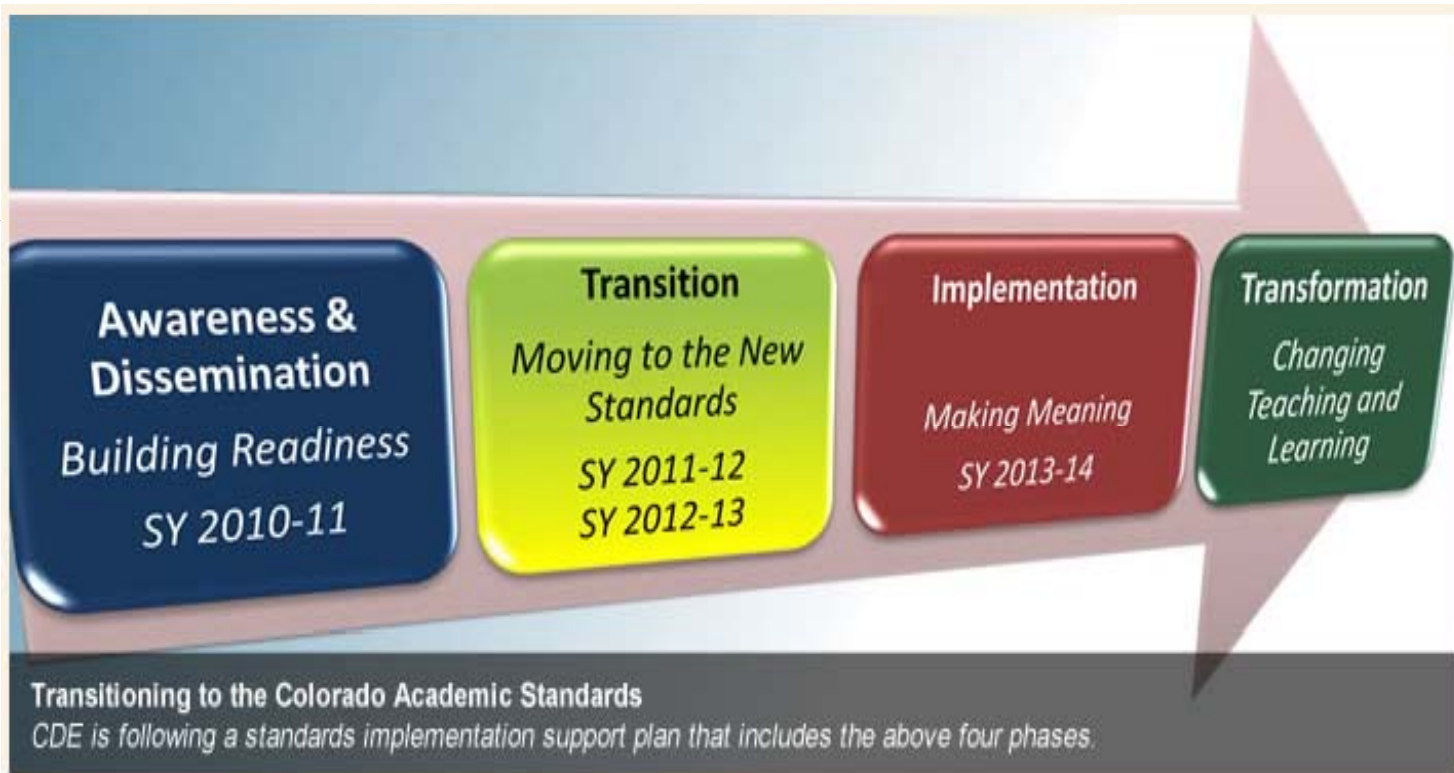
Chart 2

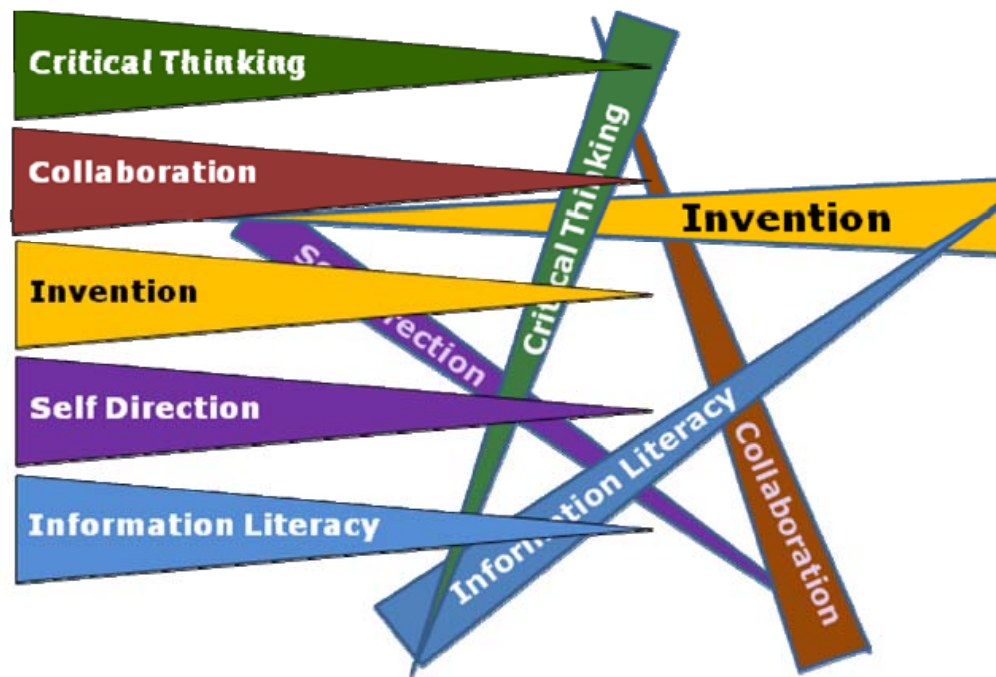
