TAKE A LOOK AT THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY.

- Are Spanish speakers coming in for ESL classes?
- Are Spanish speakers coming in and requesting materials?
- Are they bringing their children to storytimes or programs/events?

CAN YOU USE YOUR COLLECTION POLICY & LIBRARY MISSION TO MAKE A CASE?

Does the policy and/or mission state that services are provided to...

- everyone seeking access?
- promote intellectual freedom?
- promote literacy?
- other?

Can you provide:

- Community demographics information? (*See Resources slide)
- Patron requests? Have patrons requested Spanish materials using Prospector or ILL?
- Patron survey done at branch(es)?
 - Requests for materials/translation/technology.
 - Attendance at programs/events.

OTHER THINGS TO CONSIDER...

- Do you have a budget?
- Would your organization be able to sustain it year after year?
- Where can you start?
 - Are Spanish speakers attending certain branches?
 - Does your organization own a bookmobile?
 - Allows organization to reach rural towns.
 - Allows for demographics and statistics to expand in the future to branches.

WHAT TO TAKE INTO **CONSIDERATION IF YOU ALREADY HAVE A COLLECTION BUT WANT** TO IMPROVE IT?

BUT FIRST...

Why did the cardiologist recommend his patients check out books at the library?

He heard they are good for circulation:)

SPACE IS IMPORTANT...

- Do you have shelf room for this new collection?
- •Will collection be together, or will you separate it?
 - Do you have separate areas children's, teen's, adult spaces?
- If you have more than 1 branch, will you add this collection to all branches?
 - This might help if you are having space issues

ORDERING & CATALOGING

- Do you have staff that speak Spanish?
 - A great Spanish collection benefits from having a dedicated Spanish speaker.
 - Knowing culture and traditions will allow for better selection of materials.
- Tools for cataloging in a different language
 - National Library of Spain (gain access to controlled vocabulary for subject headings)
 - O OCLC
 - US vendors (Ingram/ B&T) have MARC brief records.

BUILDING UP YOUR COLLECTION 1

- Survey from patrons on wants & needs.
- You can't go wrong with adding a Spanish children's collection as a starting point.
 - Check literature awards (Pura Belpre, Caldecott, Newberry, ALA.org for other)
 - Check to see if books awarded are translated.
 - Translated books are not that bad.
 - Remember young patrons that are new to country would like to read books that they are reading in school.

BUILDING UP YOUR COLLECTION 2

- Adding an adult collection
 - Start somewhere find popular books in English that have been translated
 - We all like to read literature from authors of different countries.
 - Find Latin American authors by searching by countries.
 - Search "Cuban Authors", "Popular Latin authors"
 - Check out Latin American literature awards. (*see Resources slide)

BUILDING UP YOUR COLLECTION 3

- Searching for resources online
 - Libreria Gandhi, Casa del libro, BookTok Spanish, Penguin RH-Grupo Editorial.
 - Goodreads, Ingram Curated List, B&T carts
- Books in print
- Digital
- Books on CD
- Books w/audio Vox & Wonderbooks, Playaway, Launchpads
- Music & Movies (Midwest Tapes, TOMO, Amazon)
