### GAME/ACTIVITY DECORATION/DISPLAY

### CASTLE GAMES AND DRAWBRIDGE PHOTO BOOTH

### **AGES**

Children 4+ years

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

After storytime, tell children about the games people played in medieval times, many of which children are already likely to know. Sing/play "Ring around the Rosie" as a group before breaking off into stations. Set up several medieval games, and let children choose which stations look like the most fun. The castle drawbridge photo booth with props is sure to be a big hit.

### MATERIALS AND PREPARATION

Castle Game 1: The Ring Toss

You will need:

- Rope cut into ~20" lengths
- Duct tape
- Several two liter soda bottles
- Water

Fill 2-liter soda bottles with water and set them on the floor about 12" apart. Cut 20" lengths of rope (at least a dozen). The rope should be thicker than twine (between  $\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$ " diameter). Tape the ends in a loop with duct

### TIP:

For older children, adapt this program to focus on the history they do not learn in school. Start with books from the You Wouldn't Want to Be series (about medieval times or any other historical era).

### TIP:

For a more active program, build a giant checker game! Paint paper plates red and black for the checkers, and use red and black masking tape to create a large checkerboard to the floor.

#### **INCLUSION:**

To accommodate participants in wheelchairs, ensure that the photo booth's drawbridge is wider than 32."

# Why this topic?

Benefits to fairy tales: many fairy tales provide

- Clear lessons
- Demonstrate cause & effect
- Communicate archetypes simply
- Encourage imagination
- Give form to fears & dreams
- Help with social/emotional development
- Demonstrate narrative skills

# ...and it's a cautionary tale, too

### Disadvantages of fairy tales: Some fairy tales

- Exhibit sexism
- Lack diversity
- Demonstrate unrealistic body images
- Are violent
- Are racist
- Are overly simplistic
- Are scary
- Are too far removed from reality

# Young Children

- StoryBlocks
- Rebuild Humpty Dumpty
- Stone Soup activities
- Storytelling apps like Draw and Tell
- Alternative fairy tales
- Multicultural fairy tales
- STEAM programs
- Rainbow process art

# Elementary-aged kids

- Have a "campout" with s'mores and CO ghost stories/tall tales
- Readers' Theater with fairy tales
- Storytelling through apps like Storybird
- Tooth fairy → tooth health
- Fractured fairy tales
- Lego/sand castles
- DIY catapults



### Tweens

- Write your own fairy tale, an alternative for an existing tale, or from a different perspective
- Make, walk, and/or trace a labyrinth (or use a robot!)
- Create your own coat of arms
- Fairy tale STEAM activities
- D&D club



### Teens

- Tell your story through photos
- Discuss sexism using fairy tales
- Rewrite fairy tales for 21<sup>st</sup> century
- Cosplay event
- Fandom events
- Record stories of disenfranchised populations
- All things Harry Potter! & Doctor Who!
- Media literacy
- Dangers of appearing to live in perfect world

## Adults

- StoryCorps-type oral history program
- Moth-type live storytelling program

- Mythical road trips




# Multigenerational




















# Self-led programs
