

2021-2022 Autism Spectrum Disorder Literacy Institute, Tier 2

WHAT:

The Autism Literacy Institute Tier 2 training will build on content discussed in the Tier 1 training. Participants will develop and bring assessment data from their students, and develop balanced literacy lessons for those students indicated by the data.

WHEN:

February 18, 2022 **8:30am – 3:30pm**

WHERE:

Denver Metro TBA (Will be broadcast LIVE to remote sites around the state)

**In the event in-person training is no longer available due to county, state, district or CDE guidelines the in-person training will change to a virtual format.*

DETAILS:

Target Audience: This institute is designed exclusively for individuals or school teams that completed the Tier 1 ASD Literacy Institute. No substitutions will be accepted.

CDE Certificate: Participants must attend the full day to receive a certificate of attendance (6 CDE hours).

There will be an additional option for participants to have virtual coaching from the presenters for additional clock hours for a virtual project identified during the institute.

Cost: The Exceptional Student Services Unit of the Colorado Department of Education provides the funding for the presenters. There will be no reimbursement provided to participants.

Meals: A working lunch will NOT be provided. A break will be given for participants to have lunch on their own.

Lodging: The cost of lodging and travel is the responsibility of the participant/district.
