#### UPK statute prioritizes serving preschoolers with disabilities

Under the UPK statute, beginning in school year 2023-24, funding from the Preschool Program Cash Fund (PPCF) administered by CDEC will be provided to qualifying providers, and according to statute must be prioritized as follows for

## Priority Issues (offered to CDE by Consortium)

#### Top Issues:

- 1. 30 hours of preschool for SWD "parents believe 30 hours is guaranteed"
- 2. "Parent choice" in determination of educational program
- Funding for "general education" and "special education"
  - Slots and allocations for full funding regardless of when child is identified and enrolled
- 4. CDEC and CDE MOU ensuring compliance with IDEA and ECEA
- Identification & Access for 3 year olds (Child Find related concerns)
- 6. Training for UPK providers and LCOs (addressed in MOU, requires ECEA Rule changes)
- 7. Troubleshooting challenges and violations of federal or state special education laws
- 8. Use of special education advisory group/s to support improvements
