Video on the Internet

Autism Speaks – www.autismspeaks.org. click on “What is autism”, then on “Video Glossary”
You have to sign up to access videos, but it is pretty simple. You cannot download these videos so you have to have internet access to view. Each video also has a nice treatment description that you can download with explanation of what you are watching and additional references.
