CDE Announcement: Reopening Schools: Health Guidance by COVID-19 Phase – CDPHE, CDE and the Governor's Office worked together to develop this guidance for Local Public Health agencies (LPHAs) and districts as they develop school plans. STANDARDS AND INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT

High Impact Instruction in Diverse Learning Settings

When CDE describes best, first instruction, it is assumed that instruction is occurring in a traditional environment: teachers and students gather together in a classroom, working in small groups, large groups, and individually, and that there are no safety risks posed by having people in close proximity of each other or touching shared objects. Due to the COVID-19, we can no longer assume that this traditional environment is possible or preferable under the current circumstances. Districts and schools have had to consider other options. For educators, this has created challenging teaching conditions- not only is teaching under these non-traditional settings challenging compared to the classroom environments teachers are accustomed to, but the uncertainty of the moment makes long-term planning and preparation especially difficult. As of July 1, 2020, the decision of the CMEA Board is to move forward with the planning of an in-person conference in January.
