



Introduction & Summary of Statutory Requirement

In accordance to the READ Act, the Department will review the manner in which the READ per-pupil intervention moneys will be used in the coming budget year and only provide moneys for services and other targeted, scientifically based or evidence-based interventions which are approved by the Department.

To fulfill this statutory requirement, the Department has created a survey in Pipeline that asks Local Education Provider's (LEP) to identify which of the five statutory intervention categories they intend to use in the coming budget year to support students identified as having significant reading deficiencies.

High Level Process

The READ budget planning survey will consist of five Yes or No questions that will be collected at a district level and submitted in addition to the district's READ data file. The survey will ask additional questions to the five original questions if dedicated answers are selected. For instance, if the user selects "Yes" to a question, the second set of questions will appear. Please note that these questions may require additional information as noted in the outline of the Survey Format section of this document.

To access the survey:

- User will select "READ Survey" on the initial Pipeline screen for READ
- User will select current school year and district



- Survey can be submitted at any time throughout the collection; however, it is encouraged that districts submit the
 survey as soon as possible even if READ data file has not been finalized. Districts will be able to submit the budget
 planning survey as early as March.
- User must click on the "Submit" tab to finalize the budget planning submission process





Caveats

- Survey may not have blank questions. Users will be able to save the survey questions already answered and will be able to come back to the survey at a later time to finish and submit survey to CDE
- If user agrees to all assurances for implementing a summer school literacy program and/or selects an intervention program provided in the Advisory List of instructional programming, the survey will be approved and "submitted" to CDE
- If user does not agree to assurances for implementing a summer school literacy program and/or provides an intervention program in the "Other" category then survey can be submitted but will need further review for approval
- Intervention programs submitted in the "other" category will not be considered for review if they have been reviewed in prior years and not approved through the READ review process. Please see the <u>summary spreadsheet</u> of programs reviewed since 2013. However, if there is a new edition of the program with changes that counter-indicate prior concerns then the program may be submitted for review
