## Tools At Your Fingertips

### [UFLI Digital Word Work Apps](#)

#### **University of Florida literacy Institute**

The UFLI Digital Word Work Apps include a [Virtual Blending Board](#), which provides teachers with a ready-to-use tool to enhance whole group, small group, or one-on-one instruction. The site also includes Virtual Word Work mats for [beginners](#) and [intermediate](#) phonics skill instruction. Each of these tools include instructional videos to explain how to use them effectively.

### [LEXIAnet WordSpring Word List Generator](#)

#### **Lexia**

This useful tool provides educators with access to 650 word lists that include all major phonics concepts, Latin roots, Greek combining forms, prefixes, suffixes, and more! The lists are customizable and can be modified easily. No more searching for words to match a particular phonics pattern, spelling rule or root word! Try out this tool to simplify your planning with the touch of a button.

This valuable collection of strategies is searchable by a variety of features including literacy focus, demographics, and group size. Each strategy includes instructions, video examples, templates, ways to differentiate instruction and more!

As its name suggests, this website offers a variety of free resources, activities, and teaching tools to support classroom instruction in all of the components of literacy, including writing! Activities can be easily searched by topic on the “Find Activities” page. A detailed intervention schedule on the “Teaching Tools” page provides 40 weeks of lesson plans for providing intervention to students who need support.

### [Trail to Summit Instructional Framework](#)

#### **Colorado Department of Education**

Trail to Summit Reading is an instructional framework provided by the Colorado Department of Education to help readers who struggle with accurate and automatic word reading. Studies indicate when students fall behind in beginning reading, they rarely catch up on their own – but we change that by using a highly structured framework that focuses on critical word recognition skills. Trail to Summit can be used as a tutoring program or across Tier I, Tier II, and Tier III settings to complement existing programming or to bolster or enhance existing programming. ## CDE Updates

### [Updated Online Training to Meet the READ Act Teacher Training Requirement](#)

#### **Building a Strong Foundation for Lifelong Literacy Success**

- The updated training includes a K-12 lens and has a new title: Building a Strong Foundation for Lifelong Literacy Success
- All teachers who register for the CDE READ Act online training on August 1, 2023, or any time after this date, will automatically be enrolled in the new online training Building a Strong Foundation for Lifelong Literacy Success.
- All teachers who enrolled in the CDE READ Act online training before August 1, 2023, will still have access to the older version of the training Building a Strong Foundation: Developing Early Literacy Skills
- All K-12 teachers that have already completed one of the approved training options to meet the READ Act teacher training requirements, *will not need* to also complete the updated K-12 training Building a Strong Foundation for Lifelong Literacy Success.

### [READ Act Principal/Administrator Training Requirement](#)

**All K-3 principals and administrators** must complete evidenced-based training designed for K-3 principals and administrators in the science of reading that addresses the content of the principal literacy standards

by August 1, 2024. The link above provides access to the training options available to complete this requirement.
