### Wilson Fluency®/Basic

Wilson Fluency/Basic can supplement any reading program that introduces short vowels in words with progressively more challenging patterns, including Fundations®, Just Words®, and the Wilson Reading System® (WRS). It specifically follows the skill-building sequence of Steps 1-3 in WRS. The extended reading passages, both narrative and informational, give students the focused practice to develop the application of skills with connected text that helps build accuracy, automaticity, and prosody.

Wilson Fluency/Basic contains four Fluency Readers. Each reader includes five narrative and informational text passages of 200-250 words and corresponding fluency practice. The program provides emerging readers with fluency practice at a student's instructional reading level. It is also appropriate for younger students with beginning reading skills or for older students who are not reading fluently due to decoding deficits.

### **Program Highlights**

The Wilson Fluency/Basic program offers:

- Phonetic and high frequency word practice to improve accuracy and automaticity.
- Controlled, short phrases with taught-word patterns and high frequency/sight words.
- Longer phrases, presented in meaningful chunks to develop prosody, containing both taught and untaught elements.
- Practice with a phrased version of a story followed by the unphrased passage to further develop phrasing and expression.

- Assessment tools to measure student rate, accuracy, and prosody for each text.
- Detailed instructions to allow teachers to measure student fluency levels in words correct per minute (WCPM), and prosody using the four-level scoring rubric developed by the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP).
- Laminated Tally Sheets and Student Recording Forms to make it easy to monitor student progress.
- Student Fluency Readers for students to graph their own progress.

### Implementing Wilson Fluency/Basic

Wilson Fluency/Basic lessons are designed to be used in a small-group or one-on-one setting. Lessons should be scheduled for approximately 10-20 minutes, one to three times per week, depending on the lesson format of the program it is supplementing.

The teacher will select a passage that corresponds to students' decoding skills or WRS substep. Upon completion of the baseline reading, subsequent practice lessons occur over a period of time.

#### Practice lessons include:

- word drills with controlled words and high frequency words
- drills with short controlled phrases and longer phrases from the passage
- phrased passage

Upon completion of the practice lesson, improvement is tracked in words correct per minute (WCPM) and prosody with the same unphrased passage.
