- 226 charter schools serving approximately 108,793 students (PK-12)
- 46 districts authorize charter schools in Colorado (including Charter School Institute)
- 58 innovation schools serving approximately 38,285 students (PK-12)
- 9 innovation districts serving approximately 171,433 students
- 42 online schools authorized in 28 districts serving 18,095 students (PK-12)

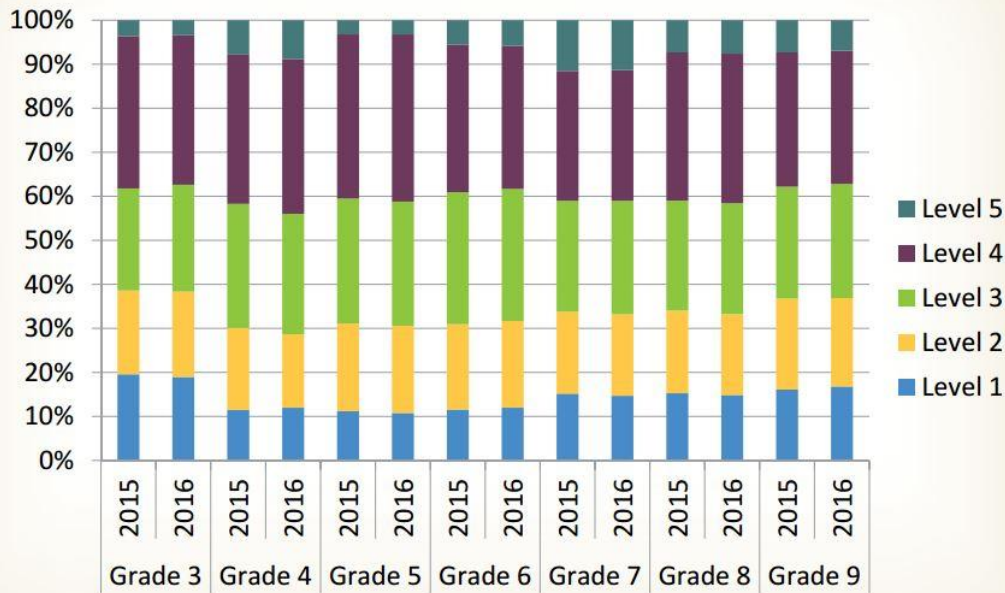

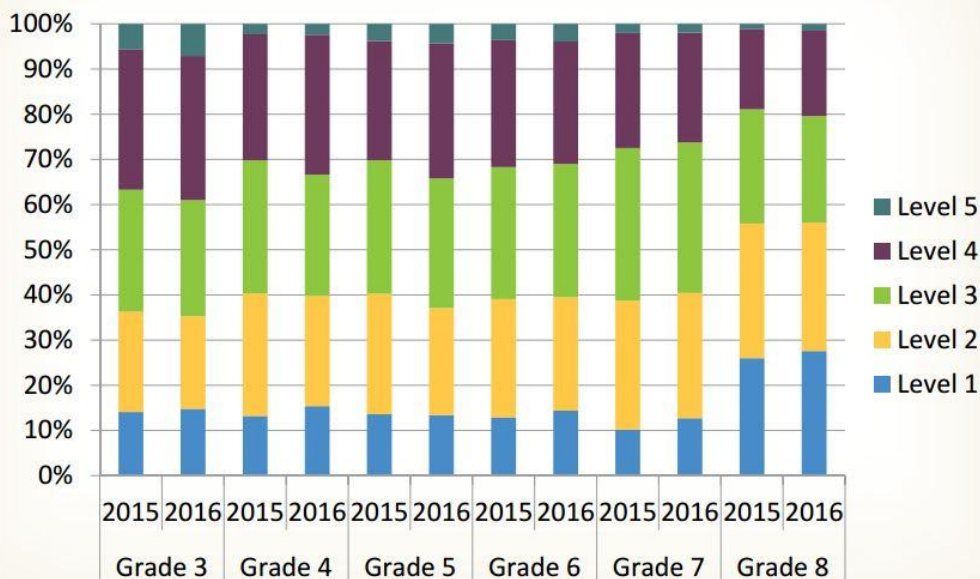

CMAS:PARCC Results Overall: ELA

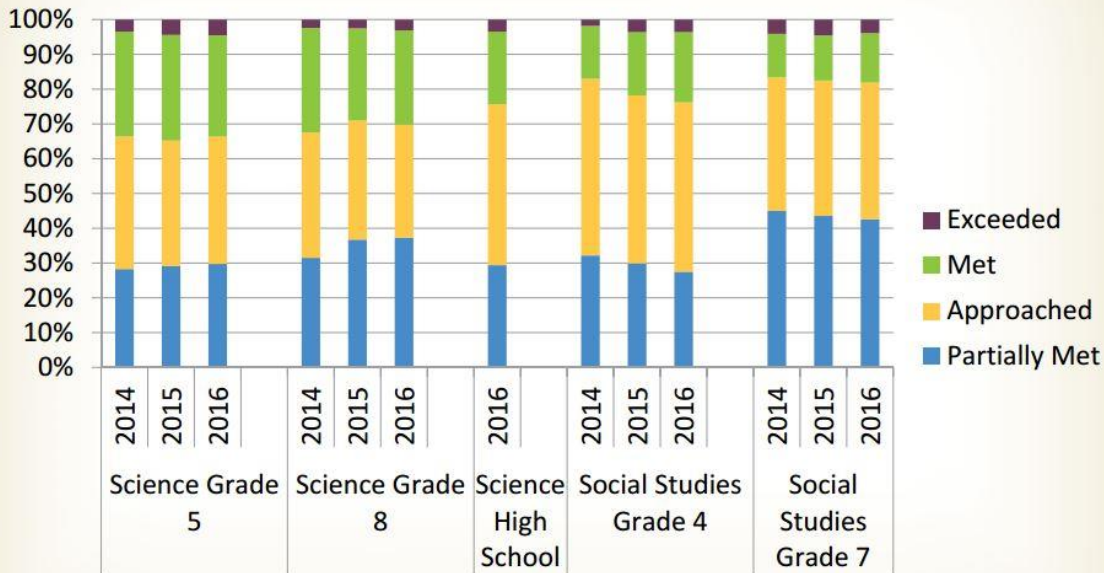


CMAS: PARCC Results Overall Math: Grades 3-8
