Highlighting The Power of Advocacy

Legislators believe that government is for those who show up. By this they mean the constituents who make their needs known to legislators generally will find them responsive. Those who also vote get more attention as well. If legislators are unaware of a need how can they support it?

On several occasions I suggested that patrons contact their local and federal legislators on behalf of the Talking Book Library. Many of you did and I want to share the results of your efforts. At the federal level last spring, all the letters, calls and testimony about the digital transition impressed the House Sub-Committee to recommend that full funding be granted to NLS and in a lump sum so that the digital transition could be accomplished in 3 years. At this writing, the Senate Sub-Committee still needs to approve this plan before it goes into the budget. But this is progress.

At the state level CTBL's requests for budget increases to support the operation of the building have been accepted. The Joint Budget Committee has been supportive and we are most thankful especially now with costs increasing more than we anticipated when the request went in last year.

From the Director

During the late spring, we had several staffing changes that caused quite a bit of disruption in the day-to-day operations of the library. During May and June we had 2 Reader Advisor positions vacant which resulted in long wait times for patrons calling into the library. While we had several other staff members helping patrons with the basic requests, some patrons were not happy.

We have about 13,000 patrons and 3 Reader Advisors. When even one is not in the library, it puts a burden on the others so you can imagine when we were short 2 people. CTBL's 2 new Reader Advisors started on June 23rd and were taking patron calls by June 30th.

Stephanie Klausner is an avid reader with an interest in assisting readers with disabilities. She owns and runs a small mail order tea business and consults and teaches in the tea industry. Her background includes 10+ years as a manager at Capitol Hill Books. She spent 3 years at Denver West High School's Counseling Office.

An archeologist by profession, her eclectic interests and experience should prove useful in this current endeavor.

Mary Oswalt comes to us from the Westminster Public Library. She was there for 14½ years until she retired last fall as the Library Services Coordinator in the Technical Services department. She has a varied background that includes working as an elementary school resource-room teacher of visually handicapped children; cataloger at Littleton Public Schools, Jefferson County Public Schools, and Westminster Public Library. She received her BS in special education from Illinois State University and her MLS from the University of Denver.

Please join me in welcoming them to CTBL. Also, I want to thank the patrons for their patience and understanding during this unusual time.

Digital Talking Book Update

We expect the new digital talking book machines to arrive around June 2009. At the present time CTBL will receive a monthly quota of machines and are required by law to distribute them to veterans first followed by other patrons. CTBL has developed the policy for distributing the new machines. Patrons who read the most will receive the new machines first. CTBL will run a monthly list based on reading levels of the prior 12 months to see who is at

the top of the list. This will also incorporate the patrons joining our service during the years of transition. Patrons will be called to ask if they want the new machine and if so, we will send them a machine. We will work our way through all active individual patrons and then finally move on to our institutional accounts. The Board of the Friends of CTBL supports this plan.

NLS Biennial National Conference

San Antonio was the location for the May conference with the Texas Talking Book Library hosting. At the pre-conference on local recording of books, we learned about the new equipment we will need to purchase for duplicating cartridges. There are 42 network libraries that have recording studios and all together we contribute 2,150 books to the network each year. This contribution equals that of NLS.

During the main conference we had updates from the NLS units and panels from network libraries. The main topic was about the upcoming digital transition and what network libraries need to be working on to make the transition as smooth as possible. A patron user guide will be developed for the new digital machine and will be available in Braille and large print with the audio available on the machine.

Patron Open House

CTBL's first annual open house occurred on July 22nd attended by 206 patrons. Tours of the library were provided by staff and we had lots of volunteers helping with the event so everyone was able to interact with each other. Patrons who were interested, recorded their stories about their experience with the library and will receive copies via the mail. CTBL will have an oral history page on our website where you can listen to the stories. Refreshments were popular and gone in no time! All-in-all, we had a great time.

Mail Room News

We have received calls concerning defective or incomplete tapes in a mail container when they arrive at your home. CTBL inspects all the books mailed back to us. However, you may occasionally receive a damaged or incomplete book. Here are the guidelines to follow when you receive a box that has a problem tape in it:

If you receive a **defective** book, place a rubber band around any damaged cassette. Place the item on top in the mailing container, turn the mailing label over so the address in red shows, check the box marked DAMAGED and return the book.

If you receive an **incomplete** or **mismatched** book, place all the tapes and a note in the mailing container, turn the mailing label over so the address in red shows and return the book.

Please do not put any strings or rubber bands, etc. on the outside of the mailing containers. This practice causes problems for the

postal sorting equipment. Finally, call a Reader Advisor right away if you receive any defective or incomplete books, to make sure you get a replacement.

Tech Talk—Choosing a Book or Music Player

Would you like to download books or music from the internet, but are unsure of which player to purchase? In her new book, **“A Pocketful of Sound: A Quick-Start and Buyer’s Guide to Accessible Book and Music Players,”** author Anna Dresner, of the National Braille Press (NBP), describes and compares many of the accessible players currently on the market. She uses the same checklist for each product, so you can quickly compare features. Anna has given each of these products a good work-out, and shares her personal opinions on each in a “Would I Use It” section.
