NFB-NEWSLINE® provides access to over 300 newspaper publications nationwide, TV listings and some magazines. Now there are more delivery methods and there is more flexibility in using NFB-NEWSLINE®. Subscribers can manage their favorite publications via the Internet and have the ability to create different favorite lists, depending on the way they want their content delivered.

Subscribers can access content via telephone, Web News on Demand, e-mail, or NFB-NEWSLINE® In Your Pocket. Telephone users are limited to having six favorite publications. Subscribers on the Web, NFB-NEWSLINE® In Your Pocket, or e-mail can have an unlimited number of favorites. Users who use several delivery methods can create lists of favorites that could be the same or completely different for each delivery method. Each delivery method is independent of the others.

NFB-NEWSLINE® In Your Pocket is now compatible with the NLS digital player. This is a dynamic software application for personal computers which, through an Internet connection, automatically

By the time you are reading this newsletter, most of our patrons who want the new digital player should have one. The transition to the new digital system has been much quicker than originally predicted. We have received more machines per month and new digital books are flooding into the library. We are all happy about this. In the upcoming year, NLS will work on shifting magazine distribution to cartridges. We will keep you posted on that development.

Many patrons are asking what will happen to the old cassette machines and books. Playback equipment and books are the property of the U.S. Government and cannot be sold. So patrons cannot buy a copy of their favorite book. In the past NLS has donated old books and equipment to other countries to support their talking book programs.

If you still have not received a phone call from the library about receiving a digital machine, please call the library and let us know.

Reader Advisors—

Just a reminder, for a period of time patrons may want to hold onto their original **cassette players (C1)** even though you have the new digital player. This enables you to continue to receive books from your favorite authors or genres that are not available in the digital format. Also, individuals who are getting magazines on cassette will

need to keep the yellow machine to play them. If you have the digital machine you can download all magazines except Reader's Digest and Newsweek by signing up for BARD. For more information on this please call a reader advisor.

On the **mail card** there is a punched hole that provides a tactile guide for patrons who cannot see the printed words. When the hole is in the upper right hand corner of the card, this side contains all the patron information and is the white or light side of the card. When you want to send the book back to the library, the hole should be in the upper left corner of the card. This side will have CTBL's address and is the red or dark side of the card. Next to the hole that is in the upper left corner, there is a printed box that you can check to identify a book that is damaged. You can also put a rubber band around the damaged cassette.

Large-print books—if you are reading along in a book and it breaks or falls apart in some way, please do not try to repair the book. We are able to make repairs and would prefer to do that. Just put a note in the bag with the book. Some of the books are old and this will happen. It is not your fault.

Tech Talk—Braille And Audio Reading Downloads (BARD)

BARD is an audio book download service available through the Colorado Talking Book Library. The advantage of BARD over traditional delivery of library material is that BARD is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. No more waiting for your books to be

delivered through the Post Office. You will have access to over 18,000 titles and audio magazines. Many patrons that do not have access to a computer or the internet have family members downloading books for them.

- To use BARD, you will need the following:
- A high-speed internet connection
- An e-mail address
- An NLS approved playback device which includes the NLS digital playback machine (see the list at <http://www.cde.state.co.us/ctbl/Digital/bard.htm>)
- Knowledge of navigating the Web, filing out online forms, downloading large items and unzipping files

The new digital players will also play books downloaded from BARD on either a flash drive or a blank cartridge. The blank cartridges can be purchased from either the Perkins School for the Blind: <http://bit.ly/9E4JO1> or the American Printing House for the Blind: <http://bit.ly/atRtEt>

You or your family member will need to fill out an application at: <https://nlsbard.loc.gov/CO1A>. Click on the link BARD application instructions. The link for the application will be at the bottom of that page. Make sure you fill out the form using your information exactly as it appears in your Colorado Talking Book Library (CTBL) account. Volunteer News— Creating Digital Talking Books (DTBs)

In addition to the digital talking book (DTB) titles provided by NLS, CTBL also has the ability to make DTBs from our locally recorded books, The Colorado Collection. Creating an excellent-sounding and fully-functioning DTB is a multi-step process, involving a number of CTBL volunteers and staff. The process really begins in the CTBL recording studio with the Narrator of the book, the Monitor of the recording, and the Review team, who compare the recording to the book. Once a book is recorded in its entirety and all review note corrections are made, the book is transferred to the Digital Audio Processing department (DAP).

DAP team members use notes from the review team and the monitor to locate different parts of the book within the recording. For

example, the beginning of every chapter is located. Once all desired parts of the book are located, DAP inserts "Navigation Pointers" into the recording using a computer program. Navigation pointers tell the computer where the chapters and other parts of the book are within the recording. DAP must also insert "Exclusion Pointers" into the recording to instruct the computer to omit cassette-specific side announcements in the final version of the DTB.

After all necessary Pointers have been inserted, DAP programs the computer to create a specialized version of the DTB and then embeds digital rights management protection into the DTB files. This protection prevents the DTB from being played on any machine except the NLS DTB Player. The final step in creating a DTB is to copy the files onto a cartridge, write-protect the cartridge so that no additional files can be added and the DTB cannot be deleted, and then test the DTB in a player. Once the new DTB tests correctly in a player, it is ready for circulation and your reading enjoyment!

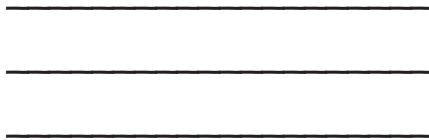
