

# 2016-2017 Special Education IEP Interchange – Participation File

## Purpose:

The purpose of the Special Education Participation File is to collect information on the services students in Special Education are receiving.

## Dependencies:

Student has been assigned a SASID (if required) obtained from the RITS system. For students without a SASID, this field is zero-filled and LASID is required. A record for the student/SASID and or LASID exists in the Special Education Child File.

**Important!** If there is not a record in the Child File, the record will not be included in the snapshot.

## Record Expectation:

In the Student Special Education Participation file the LEA should submit a record for every student who was referred, evaluated, or received special education or related services in your Administrative Unit or State Operated Program. This should include resident students who are eligible for services regardless of where they receive services and students who are parentally placed in a private school within the boundaries of your Administrative Unit and do not receive any services from yours or any other AU.

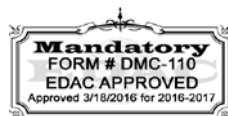

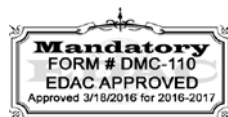

## Special Education Participation File

**NOTE: Zero-fill all non-applicable fields. No blanks are allowed.**

**Administrative Unit/SOP Code** – A unique code assigned to an Administrative Unit/State Operated Program by CDE. Refer to Administrative Unit/State Operated Program table posted on the Data Pipeline website at [http://www.cde.state.co.us/DataPipeline/org\\_orgcodes.asp](http://www.cde.state.co.us/DataPipeline/org_orgcodes.asp).

**Student's State ID (SASID)** – A unique ten digit number assigned to each student by CDE's Record Integration Tracking System (RITS). All Districts have a designated staff member authorized to access the RITS system. Students included in the Special Education End-of-Year Student collection that received Early Intervening Services (K-12) only, or were evaluated and found eligible for Part B services, must have a SASID. Children evaluated for Part C only (Special Education/Part C Referral of 01) or children in grades 002 or 004 that are determined not eligible do not require a SASID. Students reported as Parentally Placed in a Private School 02 should have a zero-filled SASID.

**Local ID (LASID)** – If your Administrative Unit/State Operated Program uses a Locally Assigned Student ID (LASID) for your students, use the LASID. This will help your AU/SOP tie the LASID to the State Assigned Student ID (SASID). It will also help to identify records in error that must be corrected. This field must be populated on records that do not contain a SASID- i.e. Part C children or PPPS 02. AUs/SOPs not opting to retain a LASID must zero-fill the ten digits.

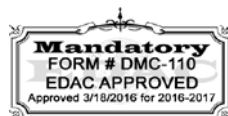
**Student's First Name** – A name given to an individual at birth, baptism, or during another naming ceremony, or through legal change.

**Student's Last Name** – The name borne in common by members of a family.

**Student's Gender** - An individual's sex.

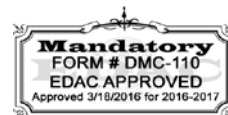

## Detention Center Pupils

• Students in short-term detention centers on the count date are eligible to be counted. Districts in which the detention centers are located will obtain a listing of pupils who are in the detention center as of the December 1 count date. These districts are to provide notification to the districts of residence. These centers are:

- Adams Youth Services Center – Brighton
- Gilliam Youth Services Center – Denver
- Mount View Youth Services Center – Golden
- Pueblo Youth Services Center – Pueblo
- Grand Mesa Detention Center - Grand Junction
- Platte Valley Youth Services Center – Greeley
- Marvin W. Foote Youth Services Center - Cherry Creek
- Robert Denier Detention Center – Durango
- Spring Creek Youth Services Center – Harrison

• Pupils held in these centers may be included in the pupil count by the district of residence if they meet the following criteria: The pupil was in attendance in the current school year preceding the count date, has not withdrawn from the district of residence, and the resident district received a notification from the district in which the detention center is located verifying the pupil was in the center as of the count day.

• Students not in attendance in the current year preceding the count date are eligible to be counted if the district of residence is also the district where the detention center is located. The district must enroll and establish a schedule with intent to have the pupil attend district schools after release from the detention center.

• The district where the detention center is located (district of attendance) may count a pupil that is not eligible to be counted by the district of residence. The district of attendance must receive written verification from the district of residence stating that the pupil was not eligible to be counted by the district of residence. The district of attendance must provide the educational program at the detention center.

• Do not count detention center pupils as facility placed students.

A - Pupils Attending an Educational Program Operated by the Reporting Administrative Unit, including students served under Schools of Choice and on a tuition contract.

B - Resident Pupils Attending an Educational Program Not Operated by the Reporting Administrative Unit. Do not include students served by another administrative unit under Public Schools of Choice, even if you are paying tuition.



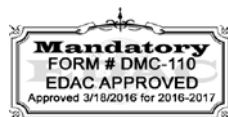
