

McKinney-Vento Education of Homeless Children and Youth Program

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The Education of Homeless Children and Youth Program in Colorado

<u>Program Purpose</u>: The McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act requires school districts to remove barriers to the enrollment, attendance, and opportunity to succeed in school for homeless children and youth. All school districts are required to designate a homeless liaison, pro-actively identify homeless children and youth, and provide transportation to stabilize the educational experiences of homeless students.

<u>Use of Funds</u>: Outreach and identification of homeless children and youth, enrollment assistance, transportation assistance, school records transfer, immunization referrals, tutoring, counseling, school supplies, professional development for educators, and referrals for community services.



Currently, 14 School Districts and 2 BOCES receive McKinney-Vento funding in Colorado, 162 do not.

Weld #6 Greeley/Evans was heavily impacted by the 2013 Colorado Floods. Within five days, the number of students experiencing homelessness in the district increased by 1,000 students. Unfortunately, due to federal program cuts, Greeley did not receive a McKinney subgrant this fiscal year. It is the first time the district has not received subgrant funding in nine years.
