2019-2022 Education for Homeless Children and Youth Grant RFP released

The McKinney-Vento Education of Homeless Children & Youth Request For Proposal (RFP) is now available. The intent of the grant program is to remove educational barriers facing children and youth experiencing homelessness, with emphasis on educational enrollment, attendance and success.

Approximately \$600,000 is available for the 2019-2020 school year. Based on available funding, established need and quality of the proposal, three-year grants will be awarded, ranging from \$20,000 to \$60,000 per year for LEAs or BOCES.

Letter of Intent: If interested in applying for this funding opportunity, please submit the <u>Letter of Intent</u> by **Friday, March 8, 2019**. This allows CDE to plan for the review process and communicate with prospective applicants with additional technical assistance should a need arise.

Diploma Planning Institute Training:

- What: 1.5 day Diploma Planning Institute –A team of experts from the National Dropout Prevention Center (NDPC) will train and guide school or district teams to analyze local data and circumstances and to develop and implement research-based dropout prevention plans. Additional information can be found <u>here</u>.
- Audience: Alternative Education Campuses (AECs), alternative education program teams, Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Low Grad rate schools, and school and districts rates that are *approaching* or *do not meet* the state's Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness (PWR) indicators.
- *Cost: \$150 Per person
- Dates: March 18, 2019 (1-4 PM) through March 19th (8 AM 3:30 PM)
- Location: Denver

Trauma-Skilled School Training:

- What: 1.5 day training on Trauma Skilled School Model Recent trends have moved schools toward awareness, but that is not sufficient to help students excel in the classroom and life. This training introduces and builds on a framework that provides strategies to transform a school's culture to be Trauma-Skilled. Information on this framework can be found <u>here</u>.
