#### Division of Early Childhood Recommended Practices

- Leaders develop and implement policies, structures, and practices that promote shared decision making with practitioners and families.
- Leaders develop, refine, and implement policies and procedures that create the conditions for practitioners to implement the DEC Recommended Practices.
- Leaders promote efficient and coordinated service delivery for children and families by creating the conditions for practitioners from multiple disciplines and the family to work together as a team.

# Colorado's Competencies for Early Childhood Educators and Administrators

- Builds systems and strategies that support collaboration between early childhood settings, families, community resources, and other professionals to identify, evaluate, and serve children with special needs.
- Collaborates with families, early childhood educators, Child Find, community agencies, and specialists to develop and implement systems of child observation, screening, and assessment that are child- and family-friendly; advocate for children with special needs; and foster professional development activities that enable staff to create comprehensive plans with tiered instruction for individual children.
