

Induction PLC: 2023-2024

The Induction PLC will meet monthly in the 23-24 school year to provide induction leaders with a safe space to learn, explore best practices, and support each other in providing high quality induction to new teachers, SSPs, and leaders.

2023-24 Learning Tracks in the Induction PLC

Within the Induction PLC, there will be two available tracks for providers. Leaders are encouraged to select one track and participate regularly throughout the year.

Track 1: Mentoring Matters

This PLC track will be focusing on the skills that mentors need and how to teach those skills. They'll use *Mentoring Matters* by Lipton and Wellman (3rd edition) to guide their conversations.

Track 2: High-Quality Professional Learning

This PLC track will focus on how to create transformational learning experiences for new educators. They'll use *The PD Book* by Aguilar and Cohen to guide their conversations.

PLC Meeting Structures

All PLC sessions will be held via Zoom. A meeting reminder with a Zoom link will be sent to participants one week before each meeting. In general, the PLC meets on the second Tuesday of each month. Meeting times alternate between morning and afternoon to allow for maximum participation. All meetings are scheduled for 75 minutes and will follow this general schedule:

- 15 minutes: Whole-group community building and support, including the "research minute"—sharing recent research findings around induction and mentoring
- 50 minutes: Small-group breakout sessions by track
- 10 minutes: Whole-group debrief and announcements

PLC members are encouraged to participate in the entire session. It may be helpful to block 90 minutes for each PLC meeting, allowing a final 15 minutes for personal reflection and planning.

Induction PLC Norms

- Start and end on time (no more than 75 minutes)
- Complete the reading before the meeting
- Plan to participate
 – small
 group discussions will
 dominate our time
- Keep cameras on when possible
- If you step away, add a comment in chat
- Share openly, including struggles and successes
- Keep anything shared with the group confidential
- Lead with curiosity
- Prioritize a solutionfocused mindset
