- · Leave room for all voices.
- Focus on the kids. Keep it kid-focused. Kids and family-focused.
- Patience with opposing viewpoints and creative thinking.
- Come to the meeting prepared; adhere to timelines.
- Allow folks that are speaking to finish their comments without interruption.
- Assume positive intention.
- Respect voices for representing constituencies.
 (Appreciate that members may serve as liaisons to a constituency).
- Good access to materials. Maintain the Google drive with the background information which will help us and aid transparency.
- Critique ideas, not people.

Funding Recommendation A: Facility School Quality Baseline Funding	Create a minimum funding level for the educational and therapeutic costs of each facility school, designed in accordance with the minimum required set of student-facing staff and resources.	Baseline funding could go into effect for the 2023-2024 school year and cover all existing, approved Facility Schools moving forward.	
Funding Recommendation B: Facility School Shared Operational Services	Funding to identify and develop a set of shared operational services across interested Facility Schools, to realize economies of scale for non-student-facing staff, services, and/or resources.	Identification of services could take place during the 2023-2024 school year and implementation of the shared services model could go into full effect beginning the 2024-2025 school year.	Year 1: \$100,000 Year 2: \$200,000
Capacity Recommendation A: Development of a technical assistance center to support school districts	Create a technical assistance center for the provision of training and professional development to support districts to help increase the number of students that can remain in their home district.	Buildout and staffing of the center could take place during the 2023-2024 school year. Delivery of services could begin during the 2024-2025 school year with priority of initial programming directed to rural districts	Additional FTE for Colorado Department of Education is anticipated
Continuum Recommendation A: Expand Access and Locations for Students Services in the Facility School Continuum	Expand the definition of facility schools to address the disparity between student needs and the existing continuum of services within Colorado	Consideration of changes could begin during the 2023-2024 school years.	
Continuum Recommendation B: Clarify and Improve the Process to Qualify as a Facility School	Collaboration of state-level entities to promote revisions, clarifications, or additional support for the licensure and approval process to become a facility school	Consideration of process changes could begin during the 2023-2024 school year	No fiscal impact

This set of recommendations work together to facilitate changes that can maximize the resources, reach, and scope of Facility Schools across the state and are supported by an additional recommendation to sustain the Work Group to inform and guide implementation and any necessary adjustments.

#2 Facility School Board - Support

On November 2nd - the Facility Schools Board held a special meeting in which they voted to send a letter to the State Board of Education (SBE) to be read during the public comment section of the meeting.

The Facility Schools Board requested that the SBE support the recommendations made in the SB21-274 Work Group report.
