What are community partnerships?

Community partnerships include every formal arrangement a school can make with an individual, association, private sector organization or public institution to provide a program, service or resource that will help support student achievement. (*Community Partnerships*, https://education.ohio.gov)

Potential community partnerships are bounded only by your imagination!

Why engage the community?

Community partners can help schools multiply their efforts to address education crises such as:

- Achievement gap
- Opportunity gap
- Workforce preparedness gap
- Dropout epidemic
- Limited resources

How to recruit your partners

- Where to recruit
 - -government agencies, local nonprofit organizations, sources for individual/group volunteers, local businesses and other
- How to make the connection
- Who to bring on board
 - -5C's of successful school-community partnerships

- Schedule training
- Paperwork
- Handbook
- Modes of communication
- MOU signed (if applicable)
