Dear Interim Commissioner Anthes:

I am pleased to inform you that, pursuant to section 9207(d)(1) of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), the U.S. Department of Education (ED) is extending Colorado's designation as an Ed-Flex State under the Education Flexibility Partnership Act of 1999 (Ed-Flex), as amended by ESSA. Under Ed-Flex, as reauthorized by the No Child Left Behind Act, since 2002 the Secretary of Education has delegated States the authority to waive certain requirements of Federal education programs. States are authorized to grant these waivers in order to help local educational agencies and schools carry out educational reforms and raise the achievement levels of all children in exchange for enhanced accountability for the performance of students. The recent passage of the ESSA includes language permitting ED to extend a State's designation as an Ed-Flex State if the Secretary determines that the performance of a State educational agency justifies the extension of the designation.

This Ed-Flex designation is effective through the 2016–2017 school year only. Any new or existing waivers that your State grants under Ed-Flex will terminate at the end of the 2016–2017 school year. Please note that Ed-Flex authority applies only to waivers sought by individual school districts and schools; the statute does not give States the authority to waive Federal requirements that apply to State educational agencies. ED will provide more information on the new Ed-Flex authority authorized by the ESSA at a later date.
