# Title I, Part A-School Parent and Family Engagement Policy

**School Written Policy Requirements** 

## Parent and Family Engagement Written Policy-Title I School Level Requirements

Each Title I school shall maintain a written parent and family engagement policy that is, jointly developed with, distributed to, and agreed on by parents of students participating in Title I, Part A programs and services. Parents shall be notified of the School Parent and Family Engagement Policy in an understandable and uniform format, to the extent practicable, provided in a language the parents can understand. The policy must be made available to the local community and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of parents and the school.

### Written Policy Requirements:

The School Parent and Family Engagement written policy shall describe how the school will:

Convene an annual meeting to inform parents of their school's participation in Title I, Part A services, explain Title I, Part A requirements, and parental rights to be involved (All parents of students participating in Title I, Part A programs or services must be invited and encouraged to attend)

- □ Offer a number of meetings at various times, such as mornings or evenings, to collect parent and family involvement in the policy development and implementation
- □ Involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I, Part A programs
- □ Involve parents in the planning, review and improvement of the school parent and family engagement policy
- □ If applicable (Title I, Part A Schoolwide Programs) Involve parents and families in the joint development of the schoolwide program plan
- □ Provide parents of students participating in Title I, Part A services, programs or activities:
  - o Timely information about Title I, Part A Programs
  - A description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the Title I school, the forms of academic assessments used to measure student progress, and the achievement levels of the Colorado State Academic Standards
  - *If requested by parents,* opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and opportunities to participate in decisions relating to the education of their student





- ONLY APPLICABLE to a Schoolwide Title I, Part A school: submit any parent comments regarding the parents dissention of the schoolwide program plan to <u>Colorado Department of Education</u> (consolidatedapplications@cde.state.co.us)
- □ Share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement with parents, school staff, and students and the means by which the school and parent will build and develop a partnership to support academic achievement [Link to Parent Compact Guidance]
- □ Build capacity for involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school, parents and the community to improve student academic achievement by:
  - Provide assistance to parents in understanding Colorado's academic standards, State and local academic assessments, Title I, Part A requirements, and how to monitor a student's progress and work with educators to improve their academic achievement
  - Provide materials and training to help parents support the academic needs of their student(s) to improve their achievement, such as literacy training and using technology to foster parental involvement
  - Educate teachers, support staff, principals, administration, and other staff with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and how to effectively communicate and collaborate with parents as equal partners to implement and coordinate parent programs that build connections between parents and schools
  - Coordinate and integrate parent involvement programs and activities with other Federal, State, and local programs including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in the more fully participating in the education of their student
  - Ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities are sent to the families of students participating in Title I, Part A programs, services or activities, is in a format and language parents can understand
