


Tableau Feedback Discussion



Option 1: Require registration

and log-in to access data

- Maintain privacy of data
- Districts can still access data from multiple schools
- Added burden of registration process
- Data accessed from a tableau-specific website

Option 2: No log-in require

No log-in required and data accessed on CDE website

- No log-in required when accessing data
- Data are readily available on the CDE website
- Data are accessible by anyone
- Technically, data are public
- Greater transparency


FUNDING

Funding for BPEG next year is anticipated to stay the same




2020 BPEG Data







2020 BPEG Data

Anticipated Fall 2021

Likely reduced number of grantees

Potential to change model of service delivery







Service Delivery Models

Option 1:

Slightly larger grant cohort with similar technical assistance

Option 2:

Smaller grant cohort with greater technical assitance





Option 2 Details:

- Hire implementation coach
- Pre-and-post meetings between implementation coach and Grant Coordinator
- Monthly meetings led by implementation coach and supported by Grant Coordinator
- Increased universal training opportunities
