## **Addressing Unpaid Meal Charges**

## **Allowable and Unallowable Charges**



Required Actions	<ul> <li>Allow only appropriate officials, who have knowledge of United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) confidentiality requirements and have a need to access a student's account balance or eligibility information, the ability to request payment from families with unpaid meal charges (unless the family has given consent otherwise)</li> <li>Provide a meal if a student has money to purchase a full or reduced-price meal at the time of the meal service         <ul> <li>Do not use that money towards previously unpaid charges if the student intended to use the money to purchase that day's meal</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Encouraged Actions	<ul> <li>Communicate payment reminders directly to adults in the family over the phone, email or send in a plain envelope or with other communication materials sent to all families</li> <li>Offer families multiple payment options, including online payment</li> <li>Continue to serve students with unpaid meal charges the regular reimbursable meal (or a low-cost, reimbursable alternate meal) in the same serving line         <ul> <li>Ensure the alternate meal (if opting to provide one) is a healthy meal and does not single out students with unpaid meal charges</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Prohibited and Discouraged* Actions	<ul> <li>It is unallowable for the Nonprofit food service account (Fund 21) to absorb unpaid meal charges         <ul> <li>Visit Debt and Donations Guidance resource</li> </ul> </li> <li>Withhold a diploma, transcripts or grades for unpaid fees or fines, CO state regulation (CRS 22-32-110 amended by HB 17-1301 08/2017)</li> <li>Enlist volunteers, parents or guardians of other students to request payment from a family with unpaid meal charges</li> <li>Suggest or require students to work off their unpaid meal charges</li> <li>Publicly shame a student who is unable to pay for the regular reimbursable meal (such as grabbing a student's tray from their hands and throwing in the trash and/or serving an unappealing alternative meal)</li> <li>Announce or publicize the names of students with unpaid meal charges</li> <li>Require students with unpaid meal charges to use a different serving line to receive an alternate meal</li> <li>Use hand stamps, stickers, or other physical markers to identify students with unpaid meal charges</li> <li>Send clearly marked notices home with students who have unpaid meal charges</li> </ul>

\*As outlined in 7 CFR 245.8, many of the discouraged actions are prohibited when applied specifically to students eligible to receive free or reduced-price meals.
