

Pandemic-EBT in Colorado

2021-2022 School Year

Overview

The Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS) and the Colorado Department of Education (CDE), thank you for your many and various efforts to ensure that children and youth in our state have access to healthy and nutritious food. Since July 2020, more than \$400 million in Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) benefits to help families respond to the challenges of school closures during one of the most difficult economic downturns in US history have been issued. The USDA has extended the P-EBT program for the current 2021-22 school year and into Summer of 2022. Previously, CDE and CDHS were able to issue P-EBT benefits to eligible students largely based on the school or district reported learning modality. For the 2021-22 school year, USDA has increased the level of detailed data states need to collect to provide P-EBT benefits. USDA is seeking data at the student and/or grade level now that most students have returned to in-person learning. This will require a different approach to data collection than was done for the 2020-2021 school year.

According to USDA, students certified for free or reduced-price (F/RP) meals qualify for P-EBT benefits during the 2021-2022 school year if:

- (1) The student is enrolled in a school that normally participants in the National School Lunch Program (even if the school is currently using the Seamless Summer Option)
- (2) The student did not receive a F/RP meal at school for at least 5 consecutive days* due to a COVID-19 related absence or quarantine, the student opting into a school's remote learning program, or a school or grade-level transition to remote or hybrid learning.
- *USDA considers participation in a hybrid learning schedule to count toward the "5 consecutive days."

For the 2021-2022 school year, CDE and CDHS are exploring two different approaches to identify students eligible for P-EBT:

- Remote Learning Modality: Identify students who remain enrolled in their local school and opt into the school or district's remote learning program as an alternative to in-person learning.
- 2) Positive Cases/Temporary Quarantines: Identify schools with an COVID-19 outbreak that results in a temporary absence from in-person learning for some students due to one or more positive COVID-19 cases in the grade or school.

In order to better understand the feasibility of these proposed approaches and what data is available, CDE and CDHS will host a series of facilitated webinars.

Below is a description of each type of facilitated session. Sessions are split up by the two different approaches, 1) *Remote Learning Modality* and 2) *Positive*
