# What is P-EBT







- The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) created the P-EBT program to assist families who lost access to free or reduced-price school meals due to schools closures in response to COVID-19.
- P-EBT will provide families an additional benefit equivalent to a free breakfast and lunch (\$5.70/day) or up to \$279/eligible child
  - Approximately 363,000 CO children are eligible to receive this benefit
- P-EBT is a supplemental monetary allotment and can be used in conjunction with emergency feeding grab-n-go meals
  - o Families are encouraged to use both



### Who is eligible?



- Families with students who receive free or reduced-price lunches and attend a site that participates in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP)
  - Includes families that may now qualify due to income loss from COVID-19 and were not previously receiving free or reduced-price meals
- ALL students attending a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) or Provision 2 site





# How will P-EBT benefits be issued?





#### P-EBT Benefit Issuance



- Will vary based on participation in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Families currently participating in SNAP:
  - No action required; benefits will be automatically issued for eligible children in the household
  - o Benefits to be issued in June
- Families not currently participating in SNAP:
  - Must complete a P-EBT application
    - CO Department of Human Services (CDHS) creating and overseeing application process
  - Application expected to open end of June/early July
    - Open for a period of 6 weeks

Schools/districts provide families with state issued student ID (SASID) or student ID numbers for private school students.



Families apply for P-EBT and provide required information including the SASID or student ID information.



Upon approval, families will be issued a P-EBT card with awarded allotment based on children and any prorated amounts



# What is the role of schools/districts?





#### Schools/Districts Role



- Provide the required state issued student ID (SASID) to families; private schools provide local student ID
  - SASID is a ten digit ID issued to enrolled public school students
  - Required component for families to complete the P-EBT application
- Promote the P-EBT application once available
  - Post application link on webpage
  - o Emails, robocalls or text messages
- Designate available staff during summer months
  - Send out communications
  - Field questions Identify available staff
    - Refer families to the P-EBT application/enrollment page



#### Outreach Timeline



- As soon as possible:
  - o Identify where SASIDs (student IDs for private schools) are housed
  - Work with IT or October Count staff on accessibility of IDs and coordinating efforts
  - Start creating communication plan
    - How will IDs be provided?
    - Who will be creating and sending communications?
    - Who will be fielding questions?
    - What information will we post to our website?



#### Outreach Timeline



#### Next Steps:

- Communicate the IDs directly to families or explain how IDs can be accessed
  - Highly recommend proactively providing IDs to families
- Provide link to landing page for P-EBT application access
- Field questions and direct families accordingly

## Questions & Answers







Q: I do not see any Spanish versions of the templates. Will these be coming soon?

A: Yes, templates are currently being translated and will be available soon.

Q: I have processed free and reduced-price meal applications during the school closures, do I need to report these to CDHS?

A: No, you do not need to report any application information to CDHS or CDE. Families can provide household size and income in the P-EBT application if they were not eligible for free or reduced-price school meals during the school year.





Q: If our school is a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) or Provision 2 school and provides free lunches to all students, do all of our students automatically qualify for P-EBT?

A: If you are a CEP or Provision 2 school, that makes all students at that school eligible for P-EBT, though the issuing of the actual P-EBT benefit is not an automatic process and will still need a small amount of action required by families once more information is provided by the school.

Q: Will school districts be able to request P-EBT funds or is it only for individual households?

A: P-EBT is for individual households with children who would have been receiving free or reduced-price lunch if schools had been in session.





Q: Is P-EBT available for children in pre-kindergarten?

A: Currently, P-EBT is available for eligible households with children in grades K-12.

Q: Are foster children eligible for P-EBT?

A: Foster children are considered categorically eligible for free meals under the NSLP. Therefore, foster children are eligible for receiving P-EBT, but will not be automatically enrolled. A small amount of action will be required by families once more information is provided by the school.





Q: Will FDPIR households need to apply through the P-EBT landing page?

A: Yes, any household not receiving SNAP will need to apply through the page.

Q: For families with recent income change, do they have to apply and be approved for free or reduced-price school meals prior to applying for P-EBT?

A: No. Families can provide household size and income in the P-EBT application if they were not eligible for free or reduced-price school meals during the school year.





Q: Do families that received P-EBT need to apply for free or reduced-price school meals for the upcoming school year?

A: Yes. All families, regardless of receiving P-EBT benefits, will need to re-apply for the new school year.

Q: Are all children 0-18 eligible for these funds? How do children not in school get a SASID number?

A. Only enrolled students attending school sites that participate in NSLP and qualify for free or reduced-price school meals are eligible to receive P-EBT.
