Graduation Guidelines Goals

- New expectations for a high school diploma, locally different and guided by common menu.
- Develop and identify areas of opportunity for students to explore and attain knowledge, skills, and abilities to be prepared for the day after high school.
- Create and reinforce learning environments that reflect high expectations for all students to successfully earn a living wage and contribute to Colorado's economy.
- Educate students to be prepared to enter Colorado's workforce with in-demand credentials and benchmarked to business, industry, and higher education standards.

Concurrent Enrollment

Definition

Simultaneous enrollment of a qualified student in a local education provider and in one or more postsecondary courses. This program includes, but is not limited to, academic or career and technical education courses at an institution of higher education.




Concurrent Enrollment Statewide

Statewide Overview

- 19% or 24,000 Colorado 11th and 12th grade students in a public high school are participating in concurrent enrollment.
- Overall participation increased by 15.5%.
- More than 85% of participating students enrolled in college.
- More than three-quarters of concurrent enrollment students passed all their courses, while 12% received partial credit.
- In 2011-12, the number of higher education institutions participating in concurrent enrollment agreements grew to 18, while the number of participating high schools increased to 304, representing 64 percent of all high schools in Colorado.

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Career & Technical Education (CTE)

Statewide Overview

- 127,114 total CTE enrollments in 2012-2013.
- 1,257 high school and 58 middle school CTE programs in 155 public school districts
- 30% of CTE students identified as economically disadvantaged; 12% as disabled; 38% as minority.
- 37% of 9th-12th grade students in Colorado enrolled in at least one CTE course.
- 52,301 total CTE program completions for the 2010-11 academic year (45,824 total individual CTE students).


CTE Statewide

- 95% percent of CTE concentrators and CTE program completers who graduated with a high school diploma met the partially proficient, proficient or advanced levels on the 10th grade Reading/Language Arts CSAP.
- 71% met the partially proficient, proficient or advanced levels on the statewide 10th grade Mathematics CSAP.
- 82% of previous year CTE completers who were seeking employment had obtained jobs within a year following program completion.

Colorado School District Map



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
Advanced Placement

State Overview

- 36.1 percent of high school seniors took an AP exam and 22.3 percent received a 3 or higher
- 35 AP subject areas taught statewide
- 80 participating districts
- 60,284 AP tests taken during 2012-13 academic year

Individual Career & Academic Plan (ICAP)

State Overview

- Of districts identifying an ICAP coordinator:
 - 54% are Counselors
 - 25% are CTE Coordinators
 - 19% are District Staff
 - 2% are Teachers
- Nearly 60% of districts are beginning the ICAP process in 6th grade
- All districts mentioned relying on partners to implement ICAP
 - 70% with Postsecondary Institution
 - 30% with Community Organizations, Local Businesses & BOCES



ICAP Practices

- Districts with advanced ICAP implementation have made it part of the culture, such as classroom time and connected activities between teachers and coordinators.
- Making ICAP a lifelong resource and connecting with higher education, business (potential employers), and community organizations.
- Several districts have aligned their ALP and ICAP efforts to streamline the process for students.
