The Why Behind the Work



Colorado Revised Statute 22-91-101

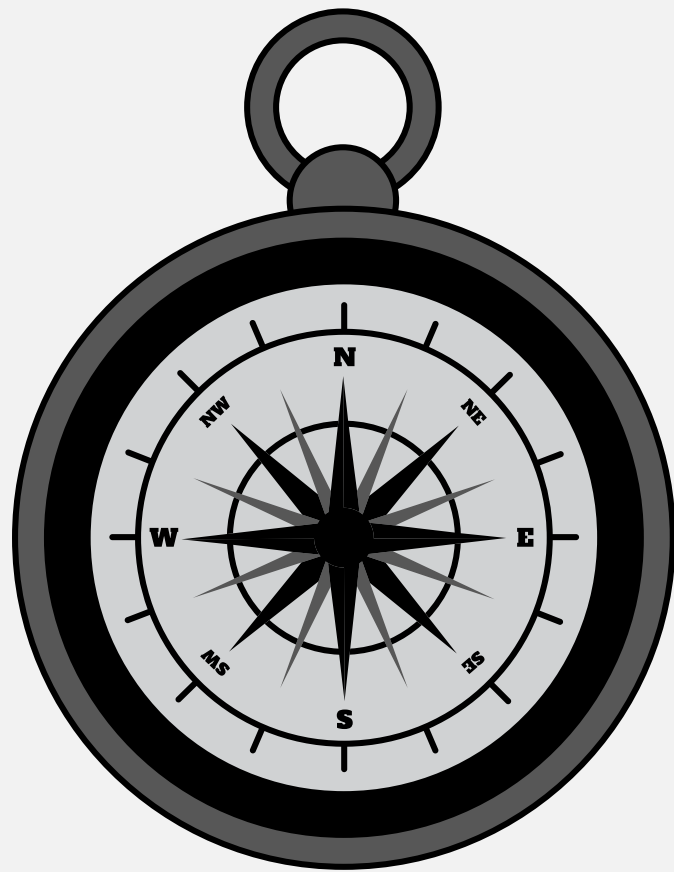


(1)(k) Reducing the student-to-counselor ratio in Colorado's public schools is a positive move toward achieving the goals of **closing the achievement gap, decreasing the dropout rate, and increasing the number of students who matriculate into postsecondary education without the need for remediation.**



(2) The general assembly concludes, therefore, that it is in the **best interests of the students** in the state to encourage and support school districts, boards of cooperative services, and charter schools in **increasing the number of school counselors available in middle, junior high, and high schools and improving the level of school counseling services** provided to students by enacting the school counselor corps grant program.

Goals of the SCCGP



Colorado Revised Statute 22-91-103

- *(1)(a)* Increase the availability of effective school counseling to help:
 - *(I)* Increase the graduation rate
 - *(II)* Increase the percentage of students who appropriately prepare for, apply to and continue into postsecondary education; and
- *(b)* Support work-based learning awareness, education, and opportunities

Grant Terminology



- **Grant Award Letter (GAL):** A letter from CDE announcing funds awarded.
- **Annual Financial Report (AFR) term updated in GAINS to “Financial Expenditure Report” (FER):** A report to show how funds were spent in a previous spending year (includes budget workbook and a general ledger).
- **Interim Financial Report (IFR):** A report to show how spending is progressing through the current fiscal year (includes budget workbook and a general ledger).
- **Continuation Budget:** A budget to show how funds will continue to be spent in the next fiscal year.
- **Budget Revision:** changes made to a budget during the school year.
- **Development Year Report:** A report for year one grantees.
- **End of Year Report (EOY):** A report for year two through four grantees to report program outcomes.

Grant Requirements



All reporting requirements, deadlines, submission links, and terms of the grant are outlined in the Exhibit A - Statement of Work that is sent with the Grant Award Letter.

- **The School Counselor Corps Grant Program requires:**
 - Attendance at mandatory trainings
 - Financial documents and reports
 - Annual program report

**Please read the Statement of Work to fully review
all terms and conditions of the grant.**

Required Trainings



- Each funded site's **school administrator** and **grant funded school counselor** must attend the required trainings in 2025-2026:
 - **Virtual Welcome Training:** August 27, 2025, from 9:00 - 11:00 AM
 - **Virtual Fiscal Training:** September 3, 2025, from 10:00 - 11:00 AM
 - **SCCG Regional Training:** choose one to attend from 8:30 AM - 4:00 PM
 - Colorado Springs - September 10, 2025
 - Steamboat Springs - October 21, 2025
 - Limon - October 2025
 - Denver - November 2025
 - Alamosa - November 2025
 - Sterling - December 2025
 - **Mid-Year Virtual Check-In:** January 14, 2025, from 9:00 - 11:00 AM
 - **Virtual Professional Development:** Dates coming soon!

All dates are tentative and will be confirmed at the Virtual Welcome on August 27, 2025.

Required Documents and Reporting



- **Financial Documents and Reports:**
 - Submit the Annual Financial Report (for FY2024-25 funds): due September 30, 2025
 - Complete budget workbook and submit revisions to Smartsheets
 - Last day to submit a revision is May 15, 2026
 - Submit the Interim Financial Report: due February 13, 2026
 - Submit the Continuation Budget for FY2026-27: due May 29, 2026
 - Submit the Annual Financial Report (for FY2025-26 funds): due September 30, 2026
- **Program Report:**
 - End of Year Report: due May 29, 2026

Let's Talk Funding



The School Counselor Corps Grant funds Local Education Providers to hire school counselors and enhance school counseling services.

- Funding cannot supplant or replace money that was being used to hire or improve school counseling services.
- All budget items must be added to the budget workbook and receive written approval before purchasing can occur.

SCCGP Funding 2025-26



Grant funds for FY2025-2026 must be spent by June 30, 2026.

- **Year Three:** Award amount of \$90,000 per funded site.

All funding is contingent upon enacting pending appropriations to the SCCGP each school year.



Allowable Use of Funds



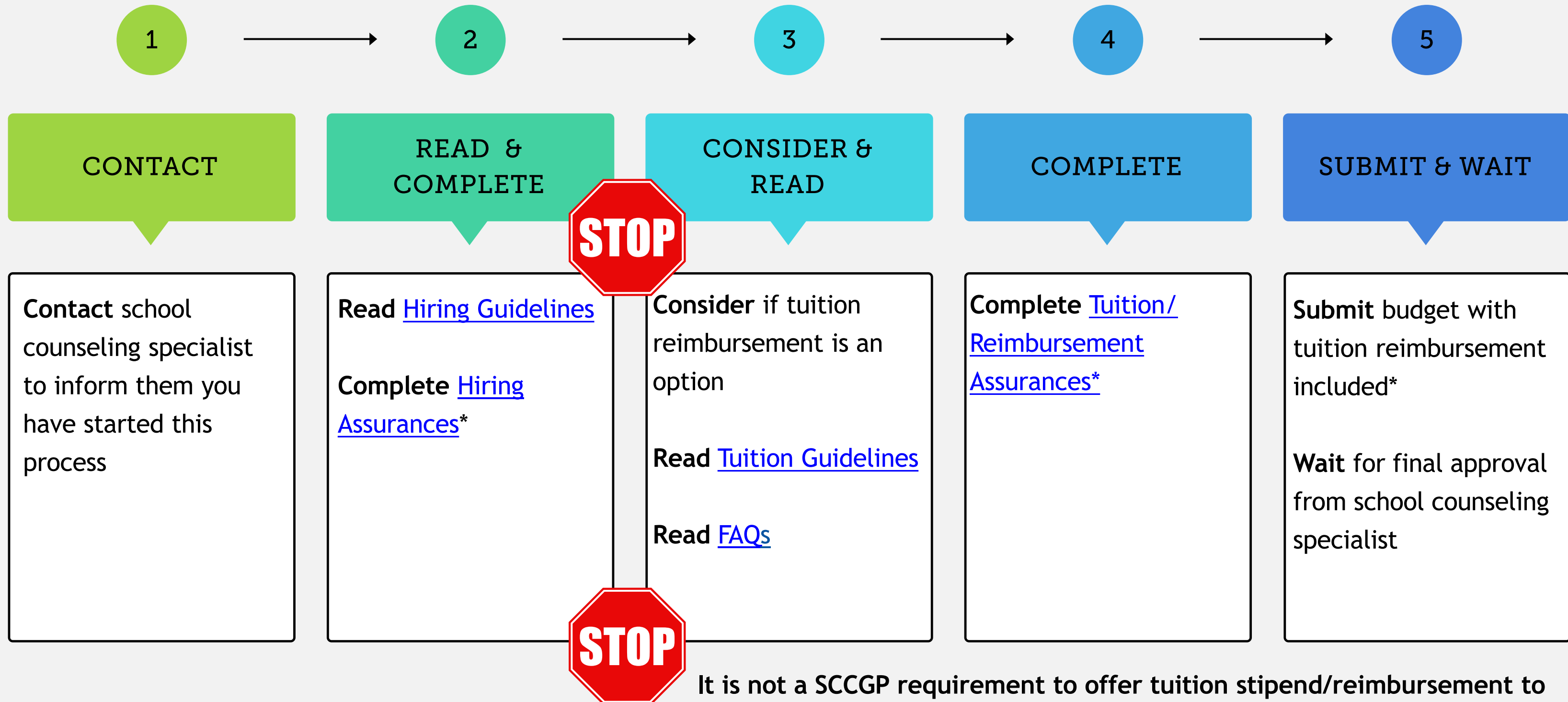
- Licensed school counselor salaries and benefits
 - Year Three Implementation: 1.0 School counselor FTE salaries and benefits are required per funded site.
- Grant related travel to in-person required training and professional development
- Career awareness and postsecondary preparatory services
- Professional development
- Events, supplies, and technology related to comprehensive school counseling program development and implementation; and school counseling program development and implementation
- School counseling coursework and tuition for approved individuals
- Consulting services

Licensed School Counselors



- **SCCGP funds must be used to hire licensed school counselors.**
 - In years two-four: 1.0 school counselor FTE salaries and benefits are required per funded site.
- Please reach out to Jennicca and Brooke to discuss the approval process for hiring an individual working towards school counseling licensure (next slide).

Hiring Individuals Working Towards CO School Counseling Licensure



*Email approval must be obtained

It is not a SCCGP requirement to offer tuition stipend/reimbursement to those working toward school counseling licensure.

Unallowable Expenses



Funds may NOT be used for the following (including, but not limited to):



- Capital equipment: equipment valued at \$10,000 or more with a useful life of more than a year
- Building improvements, construction, or maintenance
- Indirect costs, or incentives for students and or staff
- **In years two, three, and four:** funds cannot be used for non-licensed school counseling positions (i.e. social workers, psychologists, clinical therapists, etc.)
