#### Colorado Schools

1,854 schools:

- → 1,078 elementary schools
- → 276 middle schools
- → 500 high schools

Enrollment has grown every year since 1988, when the total enrollment was 560,081.

#### Charter, Innovation and Online Schools

- → 226 charter schools serving approximately 108,793 students (PK-12)
- → 46 districts authorize charter schools in Colorado (including Charter School Institute)
- → 58 innovation schools serving approximately 38,285 students (PK-12)
- → 9 innovation districts serving approximately 171,433 students
- → 42 online schools authorized in 28 districts serving 18,095 students (PK-12)






