

**Advanced – Performance Level 4 (Score range: 656 to 795)**

Students can comprehend a wide variety of texts in depth. They can evaluate main idea, details, problem-solution, and cause-effect; restate, paraphrase, and summarize; analyze sequence of events; infer character traits and motives, and the theme of a narrative; interpret figurative language and complex or content specific vocabulary; reread and search to confirm less obvious information and meaning; and use higher levels of thinking to draw and conclusions.

Proficient – Performance Level 3 (Score range: 526 to 655)

Students can comprehend longer and increasingly difficult text, including poetry. They can draw inferences, follow directions, identify main idea and supporting details, accurately and thoroughly sequence events, draw conclusions, determine cause and effect, reread and search to confirm obvious information and meaning, show their thorough understanding of test through a written response, and understand vocabulary essential to the test.

Partially Proficient – Performance Level 2 (Score range: 466 to 525)

Students can comprehend simple narrative and/or expository text with familiar content on a literal level. They are able to demonstrate limited accuracy in the identification and sequencing of facts and events, minimal understanding in a written response, and understanding of simple vocabulary.

Unsatisfactory – Performance Level 1 (Score range: 150 to 465)

Students are unsatisfactory in reading comprehension when they read narratives and simple expository texts with familiar content with little evidence of literal comprehension.
