Any day the state's largest newspapers lead their front page with headlines like these is a good day for Colorado education. The State Board of Education was present at a news conference on November 13, 2003 that released the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) for the 2003 grades 4 and 8 reading and mathematics assessments given nationwide. Colorado's public school students performed higher than the national average in grades 4 and 8 reading and grade 8 mathematics, and performed at the national average in grade 4 mathematics. Colorado scored in the top quarter of all states for students scoring at or above the proficient level, and its improvement trend beats the national average by the widest margins in our state's history.

"This is great news for Colorado," says Chairman of the State Board of Education Randy DeHoff. "Since NAEP is similar though more rigorous than our state CSAP test, these results show that Colorado's students have the ability and skills to outperform the national average."

The major findings are as follows:

Fourth grade students in Colorado have doubled their performance in mathematics since the 1992 assessment. In 1992, 17 percent of the students performed at or above the proficient level; in 1996, 22 percent performed at or above the proficient level; and in 2003, 34 percent performed at or above the proficient level.

- Colorado grade 4 students have improved by over 5% in reading since the 1994 assessment. In 1994, the average scale score was 213; in 1998 it was 220; and in 2003 it was 224.
- In grade 8 reading, Colorado is outperforming the nation in race/ethnicity by 5 points for blacks, 2 points for Hispanics and 5 points for Asians.
- In Colorado, the gender gap in grade 8 mathematics has basically been eliminated since the 1990 assessment, which confirms what Colorado's recent CSAP scores show.
- The percentage of 8th grade Hispanic students scoring at or above proficient in mathematics has tripled since 1990.

"Closing the Achievement Gap is a nationwide goal," states Vice Chairman Jared Polis. "Colorado is proving to the nation that we are making great strides in closing this very important and discouraging disparity."

NAEP, which was originally established in 1969, is the only federally-mandated, nationally-representative assessment of what young students know and can do in key subject areas. Commonly referred to as the "Nation's Report Card," it is used to provide a common point of reference for comparisons between states and an accurate and representative picture of student performance over time. Last year was the first time that the No Child Left Behind Act required states to participate in these assessments. The last year Colorado opted to take the NAEP Grades 4 and 8 Reading Assessments was 1998 and the Grades 4 and 8 Math Assessments were last given in Colorado in 1996.

"As much as we appreciate these moments of public affirmation, we know also how much further we have to go. Still, for today, let us savor the moment and pass on the thanks and congratulations to all those educators whose daily labors are lifting the prospects for all of Colorado's children," wrote Commissioner Moloney in his latest Chiefline.
