



Colorado Library Issues Face the Voters

Six Colorado public libraries had mill levy referenda and bond issue questions before the voters November 6, 2007. Three were successful. Denver Public Library, East Morgan Library District in Brush, and Spanish Peaks Library District in Walsenburg passed their ballot issues with voter support ranging from 60% to 75% of ballots cast. Voters defeated ballot issues for two libraries, Cañon City Public Library and Douglas County Libraries. Berthoud Public Library, currently a municipal library, had mixed results with voters approving the formation of the library district and an amendment to seek TABOR (Taxpayers Bill of Rights) limit exemptions, but voting down the library district's initial 2.4 mill levy question for operating expenses. Without this approval, the district cannot be formed. The vote currently is tied and a decision on a recount is pending.
