
What is the Random Moment Time Study (RMTS)?

Part of the Medicaid reimbursement methodology implemented by Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing

Randomly assigned time studies containing 5 questions emailed to direct service providers

Responses determine percentage of time spent

Statewide percentages used to determine Medicaid reimbursement districts will receive

Providers may receive one or more studies per quarter
Responses are mandatory

What is the Annual Cost Report?

Cost Report identifies annual district costs for providing IEP services

Includes direct service providers salary/benefits, transportation, medical supplies and equipment

Portion of these costs distributed to district school Medicaid Program to fund health and health related services to all students

What is the Medicaid School Health Services Program?

Program allows school districts to seek reimbursement from Medicaid

Partial reimbursement for Medicaid-eligible students with IEPs health and medical services

Districts required to use reimbursement funds for additional or enhanced health/health related services for all students

What is my role?

- Administrators are vital to the success of the program as ambassadors to staff and district leadership
- Contact district Medicaid Coordinator for program details
 - How does the program support student health?
 - Which health services are funded with Medicaid reimbursement?
- Support program by providing Medicaid direct service documentation trainings

Medicaid School Health Services Program Provides Health Services to All Students



What is the Medicaid Administrative Claiming (MAC)?

MAC is an additional source of Medicaid reimbursement

- MAC partially reimburses districts for cost of providing Medicaid/Child Health Plan *Plus* (CHP+) outreach to uninsured families
- Partial reimbursement of costs distributed to districts used to:
 - increase the district's outreach to **uninsured students and families**
 - to provide assistance with access to health care

Families are assisted with applying for Medicaid/CHP+, provided community resources and assisted with accessing health/dental/mental health providers
