Design Principles and Instructional Shifts:

- Focus on the standards, the concepts and skills graduates need for the 21st century.
- Coherence is evident in the interconnections of concepts and skills across grades and in and between disciplines.
- Rigor requires fluency, application, and deep understanding for mastery.



Postsecondary Workforce Readiness

The concepts and skills that are a part of Colorado's Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness (PWR) are woven throughout the standards.





What Are Prepared Graduate Competencies?



The preschool through twelfthgrade concepts and skills that all students who complete the Colorado education system must master to ensure their success in a postsecondary and workforce setting.



Vertical Coherence: Vertical Progressions

PGC: Analyze and practice rights, roles, and responsibilities of citizens.

Grade Level	Grade Level Expectation
High School	Research, formulate positions, and engage in appropriate civic participation to address local, state, and national issues or policies
Seventh Grade	Compare how various nations define the rights, responsibilities, and roles of citizens
Fifth Grade	The foundations of citizenship in the United States
Third Grade	Respecting the views and rights of others is a key components of a democratic society


Horizontal Coherence: Concept Connections

In Comprehensive Health and PE, an understanding of multiple perspectives and their influences on emotions, perceptions and behaviors allows students to manage their behaviors and develop understanding, tolerance, and compassion for others.

Multiple Perspectives In Social Studies, multiple perspectives develop students' ability to understand how definitions of citizenship are culturally, nationally, politically, and socially constructed.

In Visual Arts, understanding familiar and unfamiliar cultures necessitates an examination of multiple perspectives in order to discern intended meanings.





Where can I find the Colorado Academic Standards with EEOs?

* Extended Evidence Outcomes (EEO)

- On August 3, 2011, the State Board of Education unanimously adopted the Extended Evidence Outcomes (EEOs). EEOs provide the alternate academic achievement standards in Mathematics, Science, Social Studies and Reading, Writing and Communicating for students with significant cognitive disabilities who qualify for the alternate assessment. These alternate expectations are directly aligned to the grade level expectations for all students.

Extended Readiness Competencies

Content-based access skills:

- Access Skills are embedded

- Listening and attending to others who are communicating
- Attending to activities involving the alphabet
- Attending to the environment

- Attending to a preferred activity
- Attending to peers
- Attending to a communication partner
- Attending to research materials

- Q Suppose I have a student with a significant cognitive disability, but who accesses the general curriculum with only accommodations and takes the general state assessment in a certain content area. Do I use EEOs to write goals for this student?
- A No. In a given content area where the student receives only accommodations, the goals would be written on the grade-level academic achievement standard Evidence Outcomes. Remember EEOs = AAS (Alternate Achievement Standards)





Q – Is CoAlt aligned to the EEOs?

A – The current CoAlt was originally linked to the Colorado Model Content Standards and aligned with the Expanded Benchmarks. All of the new state assessments that are being developed will be based on Colorado Academic Standards/ EEOs. As you transition your instruction to the CAS/EEOs you should be in good shape as the assessments transition also.
