RESOLUTION No. 3405

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2012, the Board of Education unanimously approved a school design for Denver Montessori Junior/Senior High School as part of the 2012 Call for New Quality Schools process;

WHEREAS, Denver Montessori Junior/Senior High School prepared an innovation plan, which includes a list of waivers from certain district policies, the Denver Classroom Teachers Association collective bargaining agreement, and certain Colorado Revised Statutes;

WHEREAS, District staff have completed a review of Denver Montessori Junior/Senior High School's innovation plan;

WHEREAS, on January 14, 2013, District staff presented their recommendation to approve the innovation plan of Denver Montessori Junior/Senior High School to the Board of Education;

WHEREAS, on January 14, 2013, after giving reasonable public notice, the Board of Education held a public hearing, in which Denver Montessori Junior/Senior High School and other interested parties could provide information regarding the innovation plan;

WHEREAS, following reasonable public notice, the Board of Education has considered the innovation plan submitted by Denver Montessori Junior/Senior High School, the presentation and all additional information provided by Denver Montessori Junior/Senior High School, District staff recommendations, and the information received at public hearings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The innovation plan for Denver Montessori Junior/Senior High School be approved for a three year period from the date of the prospective State Board of Education approval. This approval is in the best interest of pupils, the District, and the community.

To the extent that a waiver of a specific Board of Education Policy is not included in the Innovation Plan, that policy will apply to the Innovation School and it will be presumed the Board of Education did not intend to supersede or waive any policies not explicitly listed when accepting the Innovation Plan.
