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TWO DISTINGUISHED TITLE I TEACHERS NAMED IN LAS ANIMAS

Colorado Reading First (CRF) is proud to recognize two teachers from Las Animas Elementary School for winning the Title I Distinguished Teacher Award.

Title I Distinguished Teachers

The Colorado Distinguished Title I Teacher Award annually recognizes teachers from Title I schools who demonstrate outstanding commitment and excellence in teaching.

Susan and Bernadette Medina were nominated for this award by Principal Libby Hiza.

"The Medina sisters... believe that there is no excuse for any student's failure to achieve," said Ms. Hiza. "This is reflected in their daily interactions with students, parents and colleagues. They tell their students, 'We are good teachers of reading. If you do what we tell you, you will learn to read.' And they are correct!"

Bernadette and Susan Medina have been teachers for more than 20 years, all at Las Animas Elementary School. Las Animas Elementary serves a diverse population of students, with over 50 percent qualifying for free/reduced lunch.

"Las Animas Elementary School is fortunate to have teachers of the caliber and quality of Bernadette and Susan Medina," said Patrick Chapman, Executive Director of the Office of Federal Program Administration at CDE. "These teachers not only promote the academic growth of their students, but are school and community leaders. They are outstanding representatives of dedicated teachers across the state."

The Medina sisters were selected for this award because of their students' achievement in reading and their strong leadership in the school and community. Over the past two years, 100 percent of the students in their classrooms have achieved benchmark on the DIBELS reading assessment. In addition, 68 of the 79 students doubled the DIBELS benchmark score of 40 by registering year-end results of 80 or above.

Reading First has proven to be a positive solution. Ms. Hiza stated that she. "is a firm believer that kids in poverty need structure and consistency. Taking away the variables so the students can focus on the content." Ms. Hiza stated further that Reading First provided this entrenched consistency in addition to a common language, curriculum, and a format for instruction. Consistency and an I Do, We Do, You Do approach is guiding instruction in Las Animas. This approach was introduced by Reading First and is being adapted to everything from music to math.

"If better is possible, good is not enough!" Ms. Hiza's mantra has been adopted by the Medina sisters and it must be working since their classes consistently outscore state averages in DIBELS and CSAP. The instruction in Las Animas Elementary is driven by data. Ms. Hiza has fostered an environment where teachers set their own goals, based on numerical outcomes, and are held accountable for the data produced by their students.



When asked by Colorado Reading First why she nominated Susan and Bernadette Medina, Libby Hiza stated simply that she nominated the sisters because they produce students who can and love to read, and they have the data to backup that statement. Ms. Hiza went on to explain that the Medina sisters, "place the responsibilities on themselves, never seeking an excuse for why a child might not be reading well but figuring out a solution."

Las Animas Elementary and the Medina sisters have embraced the Reading First model. When asked what impact Reading First might have had on the Medina sisters' instruction, Ms. Hiza stated that they were two wonderful teachers before Reading First. Reading First just gave them the answers for what they could do better and the explanations for the things they already did so well.
