# Early Literacy Assessment Tool Project REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

Proposals Due: May 10, 2013

The 2012 School Finance Act required the Colorado Department of Education to select a contractor to supply an early literacy assessment tool that teachers may use to obtain real-time assessments of the reading skill levels of students in kindergarten through third grade. The intent was to support state purchase of software that provides individualized assessments with immediate results, stores and analyzes those results, and recommends activities based on those results. Through a competitive bid process, the contract was awarded to Wireless Generation for its DIBELS Next system and Burst diagnostic reading assessments in January, 2013.

#### Introduction

By participating in the Early Literacy Assessment Tool Project, Local Education Providers will be supplied with the online assessment of DIBELS Next, an approved interim measure, and the Burst diagnostic reading assessments, an approved diagnostic measure. Participation includes any assessment kits that are needed at the school, as well as the software to use the assessment. The tool will store and analyze the results and recommend school and home activities based on those results. Districts will be responsible for providing their own hardware.

The Early Literacy Assessment Tool is designed to assist teachers in meeting the assessment requirements of the Read Act. The tool will allow teachers to obtain real time assessment of the reading skill levels of students enrolled in kindergarten, first, second, and/or third grades and, based on the assessment results, generate intervention plans and materials.

#### The software will:

- a) Provide individualized assessments with immediate results;
- Store and analyze assessment results, recommend activities that are aligned with the assessment results, and assist in tracking student performance and identifying strategies to improve student performance;
- c) Provide student grouping recommendations based on the assessment scores and provide proposed lesson plans on a short-term cycle; and
- d) Assist in generating and populating individualized plans to improve students' reading skills.

#### **Purpose**

All local education providers (LEPS) may apply. Wireless Generation, the awarded contractor, has agreed to provide software licenses to all LEPs that apply to participate during year one (2013 - 2014 school year).\* As used in this section, "local education provider" means a school district; a charter school that enrolls students in kindergarten, first, second, and/or third grades; and a public school operated by a board of cooperative services that enrolls students in kindergarten and first, second, and third grades.

### **Eligible Applicants**

As noted above, LEPs are only required to purchase the hardware, all other materials will be provided.

\*Should an application process be necessary pursuant to C.R.S. 22-2-14, preference will be given to LEPs with the highest percentages of kindergarten and first-, second-, and third-grade student who are below grade level expectations in reading; and give preference to LEPs with the highest percentages of schools that are eligible to receive money under Title I of the federal "Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965", 20 U.S.C. sec 6301 et seg.

# **Duration of**

Participation in this first year of the program is for the 2013-2014 school year. Participation in subsequent years is dependent upon appropriations and available licenses.

School level activities required of the Early Literacy Assessment Tool Project include the following:

- Obtain and utilize devices to assess kindergarten, first, second, and/or third graders on DIBELS Next. Note: The hardware purchase will be the district responsibility.
- Collection and submission of staff and student roster data to Wireless Generation.
- Assessment of all kindergarten, first, second, and third grade students using DIBELS Next.
- Progress monitoring of students. Students well below benchmark will be progress monitored weekly and, students below benchmark will be progress monitored every two weeks.
- Attendance by two Local Trainers per school at all face to face trainings and all webinar trainings.
- Assurance that Local Trainers will have training time with teachers at their school to implement what they have been trained on in their sessions.
- Attendance by principals at two face- to-face full day trainings and one webinar training as scheduled throughout the year.

For training, a timeline with specific dates and places will be available mid-May, 2013. Please note that we will have a technology assistance webinar for

participating districts in late May or early June. This webinar will be targeted for your technology support person and will cover devices and what would need to be loaded on the devices prior to the first training. In early August or prior to the start of the school year we will begin training the Local Trainers. This information will be included in the timeline that will be available mid-May, 2013.

By receiving software licenses, Local Education Providers agree to share all data collected using the software.

- This data will be shared with Wireless Generation and the Colorado Department of Education (CDE).
- Data includes, but is not limited to, the percentage of kindergarten, first, second, and/or third grade students receiving services using the early literacy assessment tool and staff and student roster data.
- Data that is entered into the system will be automatically synced for uploading. Districts do not have to plan for an extra step for data uploading. Districts will still be required to submit READ Data through Automatic Data Exchange (ADE) or through Data Pipeline.

Applications will be reviewed by CDE staff to ensure they contain all required components. All LEPs who submit complete applications will be allowed to participate during the 2013-2014 school year.\*

The **original plus 1 copy** of the application (cover page, school information and signature pages) must be received by **Friday**, **May 10**, **2013 at 4:00 p.m**. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

Applications will be accepted as they are received. By submitting before the deadline, districts will afford themselves the opportunity for early outreach support.


