Colorado Commissioner of Education Dwight D. Jones today congratulated East High School teacher Roosevelt Dickerson for being named the Troops to Teachers' Teacher of the Year.

Dickerson, a special education teacher and retired U.S. Air Force chief master sergeant, was honored by the U.S. Department of Defense at its annual Worldwide Convention in Atlanta.

"Congratulations and hats off to Roosevelt Dickerson for his outstanding service as a top-notch instructor and first-class role model for students at Denver's East High School," said Commissioner Jones. "This is an honor that reflects well on the district and indeed the whole state. The award honors teachers who answered their country's call by serving honorably in the U.S. armed forces and who now proudly serve again as educators.

Dickerson started his teaching experience during his 30-year career with the military. His merits include honor graduate of the U.S. Air

Force Instructor School as well as U.S. Air Force education and Training command master instructor and distance learning author.
