2010 Colorado Teacher of the Year Will Be Named Friday, Nov. 20

The Colorado Department of Education will announce the Colorado Teacher of the Year at an evening reception on Friday, Nov. 20 at The Oxford Theatre at the Oxford Hotel, 1637 Wazee St., in downtown Denver. The reception will begin at 4:30 p.m.; the announcement will be included in a program beginning at 5:15 p.m.

Gov. Bill Ritter, Commissioner of Education Dwight D. Jones, Colorado State Board of Education member Angelika Schroeder and 2009 Teacher of the Year Susan Elliott are expected to attend.

The winner is chosen by a five-member committee from a list of nominees of exemplary classroom teachers.

The recipient becomes the Colorado nominee for National Teacher of the Year honors and serves as a teaching ambassador to communities and organizations around the state and nation. The Colorado Teacher of the Year represents the entire teaching profession in Colorado.

The Teacher of the Year selection process includes a written application, letters of recommendation, classroom visits, endorsements from the teacher's district and personal interviews.

Nominees are judged on their ability to inspire students of all backgrounds and abilities. They are expected to play an active role in the community and to have earned the respect and admiration of students, parents and colleagues.

The finalists for the 2010 Colorado Teacher of the Year are:

- Justin Darnell, Denver Public Schools. As a sixth, seventh and eighth grade science teacher at Bryant Webster K-8, Darnell has implemented research-based instructional practices and created a model dedicated to student success. Darnell says his efforts have played an integral role in increasing academic rigor, raising student achievement and setting students on a path toward lifelong success.
